BRAINS VS. STARVATION

MOST persons on reading that the American commission for the relief of Belgium had raised \$65,000,000 and had managed to feed not only the 7,000,000 sufferers there, but more than 2,000,000 in France, where the Germans are in occupation, have assumed that all this money had come from the United States, says the Philadelphia Inquirer. This is in error, but it is a fact that it has been raised by the American commission under circumstances which have no parallel in history, and which show that brains count for more than money in a crisis.

At the start the commission was almost helpless, it being confined to securing provisions and distributing them as well as possible. But this was not satisfactory. What the commission did was to organize the finances and the industry of Belgium, to erect a great banking and commercial trading institution whereby money and credit were exchanged for provisions. It was an instance of big business foresight and organized intelligence, which is unknown in war history. It was American organizing and executive capacity which accomplished this. Americans have contributed less than \$10,000,000 in all, which has kept the commission working and allowing them to purchase and sell for less than the London prices.

The people of Belgium, overrun and trampled into the soil of their own hearthstones, were kept alive. And when the Belgium relief story is told it will be one of the brightest chapters in the conflict, and one in which every American can take pride. And they are not stopping there, but are now pushing onward into the war zone to aid the helpless children, decrepit and aged grandfathers and grandmothers, who have been driven from their homes along the battle lines.

Thousands of these have been widely scattered and separated from home and each other. By special arrangement with the German government, they are to be returned to their country via Switzerland, which means a long trip and great expense. The commercial clubs and clubs of all kinds over the United States are taking up this work, and securing the needed aid.

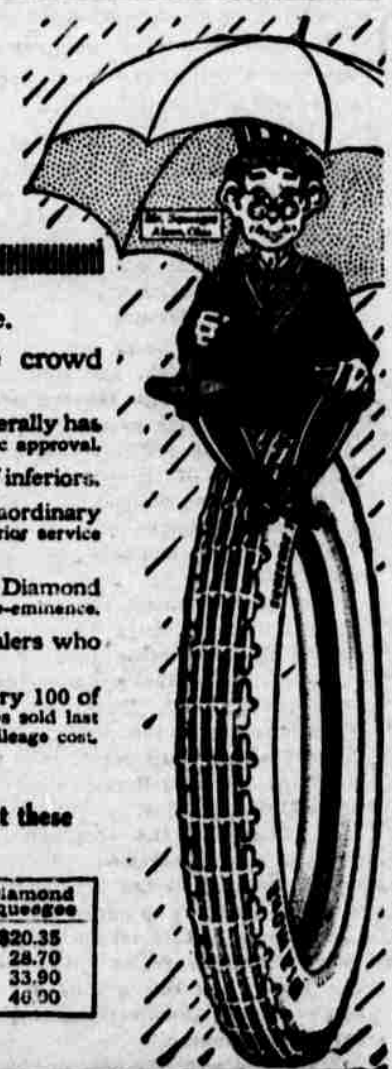
