A NEW INDUSTRY

A NEW industry will undoubtedly spring up in this state within the next few months, as the new Kell self-cleaning fish screens are being placed about the state, thereby being given considerable advertising, which so far has proven to be favorable.

Some sort of a screen that will take care of itself and do the work properly has been needed badly since the advent of irrigation into the West. The old screens have been installed only after active work on the part of the state fish and game commission, which is supposed to look after the welfare of the fish. As a result but little care or thought other than the tacking on of a layer of screens has been given them.

The result is that they have proven unsatisfactory in that they catch all the leaves and small sticks, as well as large ones and much other debris that happens to float down the stream, and soon become clogged with dirt and other trash. This not only hinders the flow of the water, and gives unsatisfactory service, but may, also, if left long enough, become filthy and unhealthy.

The United States government employs a man to take care of the big screens at the intakes of the large ditches, who every so often removes the old screens and replaces them with clean ones. It is probable that later this new screen may be so constructed that it will also work on the largest of ditches.

As soon as this screen becomes known and is found to work perfectly without a doubt there is going to be a big demand for them all over the West and Middle west, for it is something that every irrigationist that uses water from a stream that contains fish will need.

Why would it not be a good boost for Klamath Falls to have them manufactured here?

People of Greece at Polls on War Question

ATHENS, June 14.—Greece is today deciding at the polls by popular suffrage whether or not she will participate in the present war.

While on the surface the elections are merely held for the purpose of choosing a new parliament—there is no one in all Greece today who does not understand fully that the result will determine whether or not Greece shall finally issue from her neutrality on the side of the Triple Entente.

On all sides today's elections are admitted to mark what is without question the most important moment in the history of modern Greece. Aside from the gravity of a mere question of war, there also stands sharply out in the fight the figures of the two greatest personalities that modern Greece has produced—that of King Constantine and that of former Premier Venizelos.

The two men who worked side by side during the last two Balkan wars in doubling the territory of Greece—the men "who put Greece back on the map" as it is popularly phrased in all Greece—are today submitting to the suffrage of the Greeks their now divergent ideas as to the future policy of the country.

Venizelos, who until a few years ago an unknown deputy from the island of Crete, but now admittedly the greatest statesman that modern Greece has produced, is standing out openly on the policy that Greece should cast her fortune with the Triple Entente. By entering the present war and participating in both the naval and military campaign against Constantinople, Greece is assured of again redoubling her territory and thus becoming not only the leading power in the Balkans, but one of the important powers of Europe. Venizelos declares it is an opportunity that if missed will never come again. Against this action, at least at the present moment, King Constantine

is firmly opposed. The elections today are a result of the break between the king and Premier Venizelos, which occurred two months ago and resulted in the latter's fall from power. The Triple Entente had at that time invited Greece to intervene in the Constantinople campaign, pledging extensive territory recompenses.

A council of the crown at once called and in this the views of King Constantine prevailed to the contrary. While not insisting that Greece must remain neutral throughout the entire war, it was his belief that the entrance of Greece at that time would be fatal to her own interests.

Premier Venizelos resigned from power and a new cabinet that was in harmony with the King's views was formed. Venizelos at once announced, however, that he would take the question before the Greek people at the spring elections and that he and his party would stand for re-election on his policy which King Constantine had rejected.

While practically everyone in modern Greece today is certain of the return to power of Venizelos as a result of today's elections, no secret is made of the fact that his temporary overthrow has at least gained to a certain extent the King's point. Greece's participation has now been delayed for nearly three months at the very least and even if with the return to power of Venizelos, Greece should intervene at once, all the loss and expense of the campaign of the past three months that would have taken place, has at least been saved.
