American Industries Gain by European War

NEW YORK, June 24.—Within the past few weeks gold coin to the amount of \$22,500,000 has been moved from Ottawa to New York and deposited in the sub-treasury for the account of J. P. Morgan & Co. This is only a small installment on Great Britain's war debt, whose purchases of ammunition and other supplies in the United States already amounts into hundreds of millions.

Co. \$34,000,000; Westinghouse Air Brake Co., \$18,000,000; New York Air Brake Co., \$17,000,000; American & British Manufacturing Co., \$17,000,000. The General Electric Company has practically completed negotiations for a contract of \$100,000,000, in addition to an initial order of \$10,000,000. Contracts for the latter amount, ranging down to a few thousand dollars, have been awarded to manufacturers throughout the country.

Others Share Business. Other concerns known to have shared in this business to a liberal extent are the Aetna Explosive Co., E. W. Bliss Co., Colt Patent Fire Arms Co., Electric Boat Co., Hercules Powder Co., Savage Arms Co., Winchester Arms Co., Metallic Cartridge Co., Allis-Chalmers Co., American Car & Foundry Co., American Can Co., American Locomotive Co., Baldwin Locomotive Co., Crucible Steel Co. of America and the Pressed Steel Co.

Upward of \$300,000,000 worth of munitions have been purchased in Canada by the three larger allied powers.

The Canadian Car & Foundry Co. has undertaken to deliver shrapnel of a value of \$83,000,000 to Russia. In the early stages of the war the demand for shrapnel was unlimited. But as a result of the experience gained at Neuve Chapelle and elsewhere on the fighting line, high explosives shells are now at a premium. Three and four-inch shells of the high explosive variety are now being manufactured in large numbers. Many other plants have begun to change their machinery to manufacture projectiles.

Von Bernstoff's Witness Perjures Self

When Ambassador von Bernstoff, representative of Germany in the United States, called on President Wilson the other day much was made of the visit. It turned out later that he hadn't much more to do than to present some affidavits to prove that the Lusitania, which was sunk by a German submarine, carried guns.

At once an investigation of the affidavit makers was ordered. Secret service men had a hard time to find Gustav Stahl, who had sworn that he had visited the Lusitania and seen guns on her. When the chase became too hot the head of the secret service of the Hamburg-American line disclosed his hiding place in Albany.

While Stahl was waiting in the marshal's chamber in the Federal building in New York after his arrest, for the arrival of Edward Sanford, a lawyer, who had been assigned to act as his counsel, he was asked, through an interpreter: "Would you be willing to spend twenty years in jail for your fatherland?"

"Make it a hundred," he replied in German, and then broke into a hearty laugh.

HEIRESSSES TAKE PART IN WAR

ROME, June 1.—(By mail to New York)—American women already have played a notable part in the European war tragedy and their work will be carried afresh in Italy under the names of some of the oldest and most famous houses of this country.

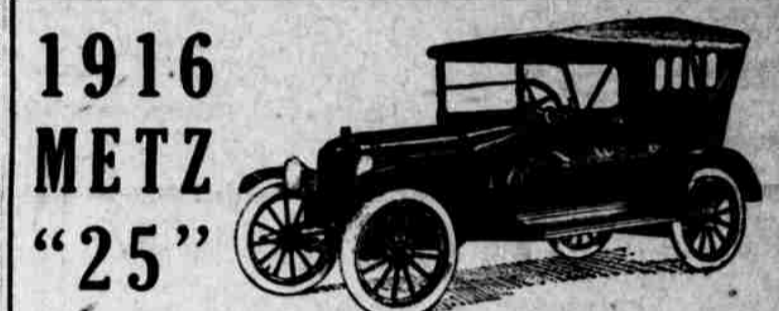
