TEMPORARY ORGANIZATION OF A SOCIETY FOR THE STUDY OF OREGON BIRDS WAS EFFECTED LAST NIGHT

The first step towards the organization of a society for the study of Oregon birds, and particularly those frequenting this section of the country was taken last night at a meeting held at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Stewart of this city. R. H. Dunbar was elected temporary president and Miss Mary Short temporary secretary.

The next meeting will be held early in July, when a more perfect organization will be effected. In the meantime, Miss Short will communicate with the Oregon Audubon society and with university authorities at the state university to secure information and data regarding Oregon birds.

The purpose of the society is to create more interest in the birds of the state and to learn their history, habits of life and usefulness to the community. The birds play a much more important part in life than most people realize, and the society is for the

purpose of stimulating interest and a regard for their welfare.

The meetings will be made public, and all interested in birds will be invited to attend. For the next meeting those present last night have taken the Eagle, American and Bald, for the purpose of study, and papers on the subject will be given. An attempt will be made to secure the Central school building for a meeting place so that all who desire may attend the meetings.

WATER FLOWS IN KENO DITCHES

PART OF IRRIGATION DITCHES ARE CONSTRUCTED AND PLANT IS COMPLETE FOR PUMPING OF WATER ONTO LAND

A ten-inch Byron Jackson centrifugal pump direct connected to a 75-horsepower motor pumping against a 55-foot head and delivering 3,750 gallons of water per minute, has been installed by the Kerns Brothers in the Keno district, which will furnish water to the R. A. Emmitt and George J. Kerns ranches, besides others, in the Keno district. The plant will also serve in draining the swamp along the river.

A force of men is now busy digging an irrigating canal around the foothills, which, when completed and extended, will place a majority of the land south of the Van Valkenburg place under water, between 2,000 and 3,000 acres to be supplied. Other places along the line, including G. F. Sevits, R. V. Ess and H. F. Murdoch will be served.

The water is being furnished at \$1.50 an acre, according to J. P. Lee, county assessor, who recently visited the Keno district.

With the lighting system throughout that section of the county furnished from the Kerns plant on the Klamath river, this system is one of the most enterprising projects undertaken in the county by local people and private capital, according to Lee.

The plant on the river is equipped with a 450 K. O. A. General Electric generator, driven direct by a Lefel double horizontal shaft turbine, under a 34-foot head, and supplies enough power for a large number of plants and all the light needed in the district. Future plans contemplate the placing of a larger plant below the present one, which will give much more power than the present plant supplies. This plant was finished up last fall by the Baldwin Hardware company of this city, and is now running through its first season.

MUCH WORK IS DONE ON LINES

A \$4,000 job was completed last week by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company of this city in the Hot Springs addition. The work covered a period of forty-five days.

A crew of twelve or fourteen men is to be put to work near the new court house on Crescent and Worden avenues, putting up new poles and stringing more wires. It is expected that this work will cost in the neighborhood of \$1,700.

Fifty-nine poles will be erected and 1,430 feet of cable will be strung. The cables will carry 180 wires.
