EFFICIENCY THE WATCHWORD.

EFFICIENT is the watchword of the day. How best to attain results most quickly and economically is the end toward which the community, like the individual, must direct its efforts.

Community efficiency comes through co-operation of large numbers working together for the same purpose. Power comes from co-operation applied through centralized and carefully directed effort.

In order to secure this in city development it has been found necessary to form community commercial and civic organizations. A strong commercial organization has become essential for the development of the modern city.

In these days of great effort to attract trade from a wide expanse of country, to bring good manufacturers and other industries, to secure better transportation facilities and more favorable freight rates, to fix on the city the attention of desirable prospective settlers—in order to get these and many other good things, no city can hope to successfully compete with others, without the aid of a virile community organization to present its claims.

The value of a strong commercial organization is recognized by the active business men of most cities, and they are getting together to the end that such organizations may exist to render the desired service.

Unity of effort in community service is the recognized and only effective, sane way in which to accomplish much for the commercial and civic advancement of any city. One does not use a shotgun for big game, scattered ammunition seldom hits hard, if at all, and very often hits what is not intended.

With the forces for commercial and civic upbuilding in a city united in one strong organization and directed by one capable head, results may be confidently expected.

Klamath Falls is in need of such an organization. There has been in the past too much scattering of effort, too much wasting of energy, too great a lack of systematic endeavor, too little attention to the co-ordination of the forces which have been applied.

An organization such as this would become one of the city's greatest assets. It would be a most powerful factor for the advancement of the city and surrounding country, in all their relations, civic, industrial and commercial. It would become a source of pride to all the citizens of the community.

What the War Moves Mean

NEW YORK, July 17.—If the reports from London are true that Rumania has refused to permit further transportation of munitions through Rumania to Turkey, the fall of Constantinople is nearer today. Except the entrance of the Balkan nations into the war, nothing could be of greater help to the Allies than Rumania's reported action.

Since Turkey's participation in the war, the German-Austrian allies have kept that country supplied with munitions. Shipments have been by railroad from Hungary through Rumania and Bulgaria to Constantinople. The Allies have frequently exerted pressure on both Rumania and Bulgaria to prevent further shipment of munitions but all have been to no avail. Bulgaria has been particularly deaf to the plea that the munitions supplied Turkey may be used against her if Bulgaria eventually decides to help the Allies.

The purpose of Rumania's change, it is true, is unquestionably to bring pressure upon Austria to grant territorial demands to Rumania in payment of Rumania's continued neutrality. Rumania is making the identical demands that Italy did. Vienna is again delaying. By isolating Turkey, Rumania may hope to expedite a favorable decision.

Otherwise the Turks must succumb to the Allies on the Gallipoli peninsula.

The Turks must import munitions. They have been sparing lately of their supplies. The counter attacks made along the Gallipoli peninsula have been less frequent than while the campaign in Egypt and Persia and the Caucasus have either been abandoned or curtailed.
