Most Important Meet Since the Civil War

WASHINGTON, July 21.—The most important cabinet meeting since the Civil War due to the existing relations between Germany and the United States met here yesterday to decide the future attitude of the United States toward Germany.

The session lasted two hours and ten minutes and the members repeatedly went over Lansing's draft of the reply to Germany. Evidence of the importance and grave danger of the situation was shown by the members of the cabinet after the session. They refused to unanimously back Lansing's draft which would defeat a formal final answer being made.

In accordance with today's suggestions it will be submitted Friday. The Orduna situation and the extent of the violation now being investigated will have considerable influence on the tone of the note. A high official stated that the note is "friendly but final."

WASHINGTON, July 21.—The government is investigating the attack on the Orduna and the treasury department has asked that affidavits from the crew and passengers and other information be secured. This followed a recent letter of W. O. Thompson's, a Chicago passenger, who said that it was the shots from the submarine that awakened him while he was on board the ship.
