

"BUYERS' WEEK" IN PORTLAND

INVITATION GO TO OREGON, MONTANA, IDAHO AND WASHINGTON, AND MANY RETAILERS WILL TAKE ADVANTAGE OF IT

PORTLAND, July 27.—With 107 leading jobbers and wholesalers banded together at Portland for "buyers' week," and an invitation having been sent broadcast throughout the states of Oregon, Washington, Montana and Idaho for the week of August 9 to 14, it is practically certain that the retailers of the Northwest will take advantage of the opportunity to become familiar with the great stocks of goods maintained in Portland. On purchases of bills of goods amounting to \$500 or more, the cost of railroad tickets will be refunded to the visiting merchant. A splendid program of entertainment will be provided, and it is designed for the amusement of both the merchant and his family. The great feature of "buyers' week" is that it gives the retail merchant and the jobber and wholesaler opportunity to get acquainted, to become familiar with the business methods of each other, and to align their lines for widening the scope of the mercantile field.

Two such "buyers' weeks" have been extremely successful in past years, and there is no doubt that the one for 1915 will measure up in much larger proportions than either of the others.

Portland claims to have the largest stocks in many lines that are carried on the Pacific Coast, and her merchants are now at work to secure the trade which should belong to that city.

JAPANESE HAVE BETTER CHANCE

SCHOOL CHILDREN DERIVE BENEFIT OF TWO SCHOOLS, AND THEY ARE GIVEN BETTER EDUCATION, SAYS SPEAKER

SACRAMENTO, July 27.—Japanese children have a better chance for an education in California than the American children, says J. E. Donaldson, special investigator of Japanese schools for the University of California, who conferred with Edward Hyatt, state superintendent of public instruction today.

"The Japanese not only have access to the public schools of the state," says Donaldson, "but they get the benefit of instruction in Japanese private schools. These private schools are preparing to revise Japanese school books so they will conform with American ideas."
