BUILDING A GOOD ORGANIZATION

THE applications for membership in the reorganized Commercial Club shows that the organization is to be thoroughly democratic in its membership. Every class of business, trade and profession is represented in the list of names already filed, and every section of the community, including some living quite a distance outside the limits of the city. The personnel of the new organization is therefore all that could be wished as to its democratic and representative character, and the large membership will reach the number expected by the most optimistic in fixing the number to be sought.

Three of the five essentials for the proper conduct of an organization of this character are therefore attained: First, a form of organization adequate for serving in the best possible way the interests of the entire community, and doing this according to the principle of the highest business efficiency and integrity.

Second, a large and representative membership, covering all sections, all interests and all the city's activities which have to do with the community welfare as a whole.

Third, an adequate working capital to meet the requirements of the work in hand, as outlined in preparing to render this community service.

There are two more essentials for the complete success of the organization as a servant of the citizens as a community. The fifth and sixth essentials are:

Fifth, the proper officering of the institution with men of broad mind, administrative ability and willingness to serve, having the one object in view of rendering that service for the good of all.

Sixth, and the most important—because without it all the rest becomes ineffective—a willingness and desire on the part of all the members to discharge their full duty to the community by rendering what service they can through the organization, by counsel and readiness to give their personal service and time in carrying out the work of the organization. With this may be coupled another important factor: the co-operation of the citizens of the community who are not identified with the organization as members.

In the progress thus far made has appeared evidence sufficient to justify the prediction that all these requirements will be fully met in this great new organization, and that it will prove one of the most potent of factors in the steady and proper development of this community.

Because of the excellent showing made in the get-together movement, and the broad lines indicated, it behooves every thinking citizen to place himself on the side of constructive helpfulness and against destructive and useless fault-finding.

WOOD TO BE SOLD
BY CORD ONLY NOW

DEPUTY SEALER OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES NOTIFIES DISTRICT SEALERS TO THIS EFFECT—LAW NOW IN FORCE

SALEM, July 30.—Deputy Sealer of Weights and Measures Buchtel has notified district sealers that the laws of 1915 require that millwood, slab wood, block wood, ties and sawed cord wood shall be sold by the cord and fraction of a cord, and not by the load, and coal and ice shall be sold by weight. There is a mandatory requirement that a definite statement be made by the dealer as to the quantity sold, whether written or oral, says Buchtel.

MEET OF LORD'S
DAY CONGRESS

FAMOUS MEN FROM ALL OVER THE UNITED STATES GATHER IN OAKLAND—SECRETARY DANIELS WRITES PAPER

OAKLAND, July 30.—Famous statesmen, educators, religious leaders and scientists of America and twenty-one foreign countries attended the opening of the International Lord's Day congress here today. The distinguished men present include Judge Alton B. Parker of New York, at one time a candidate for the office of president of the United States; Secretary of Labor William B. Wilson, Vice President Thomas R. Marshall and governors of half a dozen states.

President Wilson is honorary president of the great organization, whose chief aim is directed toward the reduction of Sunday labor in all continuous industries. Secretary of the Navy Daniels is deeply interested in the work of this congress, and has written a paper on the "Sunday Schedule for the United States Navy" to be read at one of the sessions.
