**HUMAN WAR IS DECLARED**

**A** WAR on nuisances in Klamath  
 Falls has been declared by the  
 city officials of Klamath Falls, including  
 Mayor Mason, the councilman,  
 City Health Officer Dr. Truax and  
 Chief of Police Baldwin. Every one  
 of them is of the firm belief that any  
 number of objectionable places, as  
 certain livery stables, barn yards, res-  
 taurants, meat markets, and other  
 places, are so objectionable that the  
 owners or their agents are liable to be  
 placed before the police judge in  
 the near future, unless some action is  
 taken by them to abate the nuisance.

The city officials are to be com-  
 mended on their attitude and the  
 steps taken last night to do away with  
 these nuisances. The only question is,  
 whether they will be followed up  
 with such force that it will make all  
 pieces to the mark. Klamath Falls has  
 an ordinance so strong that, as  
 Councilman Duty expressed it last  
 night, "a fly cannot live in Klamath  
 Falls" under the ordinance.

In the past two weeks City Health  
 Officer Dr. Truax and Chief of Police  
 Baldwin have thoroughly covered the  
 city, investigating complaints of nuis-  
 ances, as well as the more prominent  
 standing nuisances that have been  
 here for years. The forces were gath-  
 ered last night at the council meet-  
 ing, and a general discussion of ways  
 and means to abate them was held,  
 with the result that the council is  
 ready and willing to back the chief  
 and city health officer in taking ex-  
 treme measures to rid the city of a  
 number of places that are particularly  
 objectionable, if it is necessary.

In the first place the city found that  
 it was harboring a dumping ground  
 on its lot near the apple tank, which  
 is a breeding place of flies and dis-  
 ease. Steps will be taken to see that  
 this is properly and regularly attend-  
 ed to, and all refuse placed there  
 promptly covered with earth. Coun-  
 cilman Duty promised to set an exam-  
 ple to the city, and cover his two lots  
 to which objection and complaint have  
 been made.

There are any number of places in  
 the city that have been notified, and  
 the owners or agents of the owners  
 have been requested to either con-  
 nect them up with sewers where need-  
 ed, or to see that they are properly  
 kept up. All manner of replies, ex-  
 cept and except attempts have been  
 the result of such notifications in the  
 past. In a few cases the places have  
 been cleaned up.

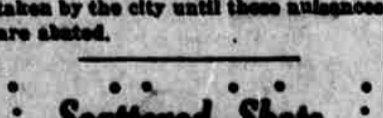
In the report given by Dr. Truax  
 and Chief Baldwin it developed that  
 several places would have to have  
 considerable work done to accomplish  
 the results desired. One livery stable  
 near the river, it was stated, would  
 have to be taken up and the ground underneath  
 cleaned out or otherwise made un-  
 sanitary. Another stable has been dump-  
 ing its refuse into a swamp nearby.  
 Another stable has put its refuse into  
 the yard in the rear for the past sev-  
 eral years, and charges \$5 cents per  
 load to anyone hauling it away. One  
 meat market throws its slop water in  
 the rear of the shop, there coming  
 to be no connection with a sewer.  
 Other meat markets and restaurants  
 have no garbage cans, or, if so, no  
 covers. The refuse is hauled away  
 periodically, sometimes.

All this is an unbearable state of  
 affairs, and one that should not be  
 tolerated for another week. Many  
 of these places have been notified, and  
 within the next week, unless pro-  
 visions are made for complying with the  
 health laws of this city, somebody  
 should be held into the police court  
 and requested to add to the city's ex-  
 ceptor. There would be less trouble  
 in the future. It is a sad state of  
 affairs and it is a sad state of affairs  
 that there is a state health officer who  
 should be reprimanded. On a recent  
 visit to this city, and after inspecting  
 the restaurants, he stated that there  
 was but one which would "get by."  
 These things should be reported, and  
 action taken on them. No means  
 should be spared to see that all such
