Klamath Schools Show **Great Progress in Year** 

COMPARISON OF TWO PAST YEARS SHOW STEADY ADVANCEMENT IN SCHOOLS-AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS. MORE BUILDINGS AND MORE TRACHERS, INDICATING STEADY GROWTH IN THE EDUCATIONAL FIELD

The following annual county report of the schools of Klamath county has been completed by County Superintendent Fred Peterson and has been sent to the state superintendent.

Almost every item in the report shows a healthy condition of schools of the county. The rural schools in particular have made great progress in the last few years. The school houses are nearly all modern, and with one or two exceptions measure up to the state standard. The salaries are b etter than ever, and the teachers pomees a higher grade of qualifications than ever before. The rural teacher receives more on the average than the assistant in the city schools. In this way the rural schools are able to attract the better class of teachers., With better buildings, better equip-ment, a well prepared corps of teachers, more school interest, the next year should show still greater progress.


