FREAK BOAT IN WATER SATURDAY
J. V. HOUSTON, BUILDER, WILL LAUNCH CRAFT TOMORROW IF WEATHER IS FAVORABLE—INVOLVES NEW PRINCIPLE
The odd looking boat that has been attracting so much attention for the past few days in the corner at Second and Main streets, built by J. V. Houston, will be launched tomorrow afternoon at 1 o'clock at Telford's boat house, the weather permitting.
The boat is one of the oddest structures ever built for motor purposes. It is without hull or stern, it might be said; two barrels tipped with pointed ends form the bow. The ends are constructed of metal, and have three compartments so that in case one should become punctured, the other compartments will keep it afloat.
The propelling power is a six horsepower gas engine, two cylinders, and is equipped with one of the best carburetors known and the first one of its kind to reach Klamath Falls. By means of a chain drive and gears the sprocket wheel attached to the huge barrel drum in the rear on which are attached the paddles is geared to 125 revolutions per minute. Through means of other chain apparatus the paddles are so controlled that they go into the water straight and come out straight, thus avoiding the friction and need of extra power that would be needed in forcing the paddles directly in the water and then lifting them out. They are fixed on the drum, and revolve with it.
Mr. Houston does not promise anything for his craft, but interested in the idea, and with hopes that it may prove practical, he has worked on the idea and had the boat constructed.

With the exception of the engine, the entire work has been done here. The construction work was done by A. F. Stankey, the castings made by the Klamath Falls Iron Works, and the plumbing by H. Boivin. Mr. Houston has filed his papers for a patent on the mechanical parts of the boat.
The idea is that the faster the drum in the rear revolves the higher it will set in the water, thus cutting down the resistance and increasing the speed. Mr. Houston hopes to show that more power can be secured from this idea than through larger sized engines, such as the 200 horsepower engines used in racing boats.
In order to remove it from its present place the panel of glass in the building must be taken out, and it will be carried to the water. Barring accidents, Mr. Houston will launch it at about 1 o'clock, and if conditions are favorable, test it out.
