ONE FLAG

IF THE Vienna government can punish Austrian subjects for working in American munition factories, it can punish them for serving in the American army should this country go to war.

If Europeans in this country, naturalized or unnaturalized, are subject to control or regulation in any particular by European governments or European laws, America, as a nation, is little more than a shadow.

If naturalized citizens in the United States are still part Austrian, or French, or German, or Italian, or British, as some European governments contend, and as some naturalized citizens seem to think, this country is more a nation in name than it is in substance.

These issues are projected before the country by the flagrant action of Ambassador Dumba. Dumba is warning Austrian subjects that they must cease work in American munition factories, and in his secret connivance to bring about strikes in certain industries, has made these questions a living, throbbing force in this country. They have long had a place in the American public mind because of the propaganda by sympathizers with some of the belligerents against the sale of war materials by American manufacturers.

A nation cannot be securely built from material that admits a dual allegiance. If all the citizens of this republic were only partly loyal to the United States because of allegiance to some European government, we should be a sorry nation. If European ideals and European laws have been transplanted in sufficient volume to American soil, our strength as a republic is seriously impaired.

Nobody questions for one minute the privilege of every foreign-born resident or descendant of a foreign-born resident to have a filial reverence and esteem for the land of nativity. Tens of thousands of such American residents cherish the mother land, but at the same time yield an undivided allegiance to the people and the free institutions of America. Their spirit is the spirit that along with that of native American stock is the hope and strength of the republic.

Dumba, by his folly, has thrust a vital and profound issue upon this country, an issue that President Wilson has recognized and signalled by peremptory request for the recall of the offending diplomat. It is an issue that will remain uppermost in the American public mind for a long time to come, for it seriously concerns the sovereignty and solidarity of the republic.

As seen by the unanimous and unqualified approval of the president's action, there is an overwhelming sentiment against the admission in this country of a divided allegiance.

It is an overwhelming sentiment against the maintenance in this country of a little France, a little Germany, a little Russia, a little England, a little Austria or a little Italy.

It is an overwhelming sentiment for an America with one people, one country, one flag.—Portland Journal.

Allan Liner Sunk by Torpedo, and Map of German Operations



The Hesperian

The Hesperian, the Allan Line steamship, on her way from Liverpool to Montreal with many passengers and a crew, among whom were two or three Americans, was sunk by a German torpedo a few days after German Ambassador von Bernstorff gave his word—and the word of his government—that no more liners would be sunk without warning. The officers and passengers on the Hesperian say no warning was given. This raised anew complications with Germany. The strained situation which was alleviated by the statement of the German ambassador again exists.

The map shows the operations of the German submarines around the British Isles. More than 150 vessels have been sunk since February 18, when the German war zone decree went into effect. The map where 111 ships have gone down between February 18 and June 1.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 13.—Alec McLean, from whom Jack London drew the principal character, Wolf Larsen, in his book, "The Sea Wolf," was not the cold-blooded wretch portrayed by London, according to Captain Thompson, who recently made a perilous trip from Unga, Alaska, in an 18-foot dory, to this city.

"I knew McLean intimately," says Thompson. "I've 'mushed' with him, I've drunk with him, and I've fought with him, and in all my associations I've found the man as tender hearted as a child. When the 'Wolf,' he was called because of his ferocious appearance, became angry, I'll admit he was a blazing fire-eater, but it would take a lot to arouse him."
