NOVEMBER 2 TO BE BIGGEST DAY

LARGEST ATTENDANCE EXPECTED
THEN—A BOMBS, LIVESTOCK
AND AGRICULTURAL SHOWS
BILLED FOR OCTOBER

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 1.—There are seventy-two big and little conventions scheduled for the exposition during the month of October, and of these more than a dozen will be devoted to livestock and agriculture. The horse show is scheduled for the days between September 30 and October 13. Horticulture week begins October 11.

The exposition management hopes to make November 2 the greatest day of the big fair. This is to be San Francisco Day, and a crowd of 500,000 is the ambition. The largest aggregation of people heretofore was that of "Opening Day" a total of 325,000 being in attendance on that day. But every stream is placed on this final great day, and there is general confidence that the desired figure will be reached. One of the features calculated to attract is that of giving away twenty gifts of \$100 in cash to each holding lucky numbers given away at the gates. Exhibitors have arranged to give away 100,000 gifts. Besides the monster parade, there will be a sham battle during the afternoon between the United States army and the naval forces in the bay. At night the Monitor and the Merrimack will engage in a spectacular duel and the most magnificent of all the exposition fireworks will be on display. Of course the stars will fly. It is expected that "Art Smith the Beloved" will have returned by that time. Just now Charles Miles and Silvio Pettibone are giving both day and night flights, and the flights prove great attractions. Christofferson is also flying in a monoplane, carrying passengers about the bay at \$10 each. And he gets about a dozen each morning.

DURING the week beginning October 11 the business men of Klamath Falls will try out an experiment which will be watched with great interest by many people both in Klamath Falls and throughout the county.

It is admitted that hundreds of thousands of dollars of Klamath county money are annually spent outside of the county, which rightfully and naturally should be left in this section, instead of being sent to be used for the up-building of other communities.

The merchants claim that this vast amount of money could be spent just as advantageously with the business men of this section, and that these sending away for goods do not receive any greater bargains than if they had purchased their supplies at home. They assert that the same goods can be purchased here as cheaply and in many cases at a much lower cost. Further than this, they say they are willing and anxious to prove it.

If it is true that the same goods can be bought in Klamath county at even the same price as would have to be paid by sending away, then it should be evident to everyone that residents of this section who send their money to outside cities are acting against their own personal interest and good. Every dollar sent away means just that much less wealth in the country in which a man is making a living.

If someone was to come to Klamath county and spend a million dollars among the people here, no one will deny but that it would mean good times for all the people of this section. On the other hand, if the people of this county take a million dollars of the available money supply and send it to foreign parts, the result cannot but be just the opposite. In the course of time the country will be impoverished, and there will be no money for improvements, investments and the employment of laborers.

No one will deny the right of any citizen to spend his money where he can buy the most and best goods for the least money. It would be foolish to ask anyone to spend their money here if they had to pay more for supplies than elsewhere, or if they could not secure the kind or quality desired.

In order to prove to the people living throughout this section that the regular prices offered by the merchants of this city are not greater than those paid by people sending away for supplies, and in most cases, quality considered, the prices are much lower, the Business Men's Association has named a week from October 11th to the 16th, during which they invite the farmers and residents of this section to come to Klamath Falls and make an honest investigation.

No confident are the business men that they will be able to prove their claims that they have offered to pay the cost of the trip of the visitors by furnishing their profits in a large line of staple supplies, which are needed and must be bought somewhere, by those who are asked to come here. Farmers needing supplies can more than save the cost of their trip by taking advantage of these special bargains. It is desired that the farmers and other residents of this section bring along their list of needed supplies, and permit the merchants to quote their prices on the goods. With these prices as a comparison can be made with catalogue prices or the invoices of former purchases made elsewhere.

The burden of proof rests on the business men of this city, and we believe, if given the opportunity, that they will make good. If they do so, it should result in greatly reducing, if not entirely eliminating, the annual loss of hundreds of thousands of dollars to Klamath county.

WAR PLAY BEGINS WITH COAST RAID

DREADNOUGHTS AND TRANS-
PORT SHIPS ATTACK ATLANTIC
COAST FROM NORFOLK TO
CAPE COD—FLETCHER LEADS

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 1.—A heavy line of dreadnaughts and an auxiliary fleet of transport ships at sunrise today attacked the Atlantic coast from Norfolk to Cape Cod.

However, it was nothing to get excited about—just the beginning of the annual naval war game for the Atlantic fleet under the direction of Admiral Frank F. Fletcher. In the coast attack last spring the U. S. Navy was badly licked, owing to a shortage of swift battle cruisers. The enemy landed on the Virginia coast under cover of a heavy fog and captured Washington with little difficulty.
