QUEEN MOTHER
TO WOUNDED MEN

TREATS ITALIAN SOLDIERS AS
MOTHER TREATS SONS—GIVES
GIFTS TO SOLDIERS WHO AP-
PRECIATED KINDNESS

ROME, Oct. 2.—(By mail)—Twelve soldiers cured of their wounds and anxious to return to the front, left the Villa Margherita hospital in Rome the other day. As they passed the big doors they paused in salute to a handsome silver-haired woman, who, all sympathy and kindly interest, awaited them. A table filled with gifts stood at her side.

The silver-haired woman was the Queen Mother Margherita herself. The twelve recovered soldiers were on their way to their respective homes for a brief "holiday" before returning to the front.

Through their corporal they told the queen that in all their lives they had never dreamed of having such splendid care and so wonderful a home as they had enjoyed at the queen mother's hospital in the villa.

The queen indeed has bestowed upon these soldiers in her villa the intimate and detailed attention such as a mother at home would give her own children. Before they left it was the queen mother's desire that the twelve assemble, as she wished to give them a little gift as a remembrance of their visit.

The gifts were artistic bags containing, among other fittings, a purse with ten francs, a wrist watch, a cigarette case filled with fine cigarettes, twelve handkerchiefs and many other little objects.

PLAN BIG FEED

IDEA HATCHED LATE SATURDAY
FOR NOVEL FEATURE—FARM-

A novel plan for Klamath Day, to be observed October 29th, at the exposition, was hatched late Saturday afternoon among Klamath Falls boosters. It is to have a Klamath dinner, to which farmers and leading men throughout the country will be invited.

A half of a Klamath beef would be shipped to the fair, and juicy roasts from this would constitute the meat course. All kinds of vegetables, potatoes, turnips—everything in the edible line that is raised in Klamath county will accompany the beef. Several Klamath county sportsmen say that a game course could be served, too if the ducks and geese are flying by that time. Klamath county bread, made of 47 per cent gluten wheat, will constitute the important part of the dinner. For dessert, Klamath county fruit can be served.

On October 29th a large number of Eastern farmers will be present at the exposition, and many representatives from these would be among the guests.

FIRST STEP IN
DRAINAGE GIVEN

OFFICIALS OF KLAMATH DRAIN-
AGE DISTRICT ERECTS GATES
AT THE STRAITS TO SHUT WA-

The first steps in the drainage of the lower Klamath Marsh was accomplished Saturday, when officials of the Klamath Drainage District erected gates at the straits that will prevent the high water from overflowing into the Klamath marsh, but will force all the overflow toward Keno.

Co-operation with the reclamation service was necessary before the gates could be erected. This was done, and the work completed before high water. There are 53,000 acres affected.

FRUIT BUILDING
IS STAGE CENTER

HORTICULTURAL PALACE AT EX-
POSITION WILL BE SCENE OF
HIGH FESTIVITIES—DAY OF
GIFTS PLANNED

OREGON BUILDING, P. P. I. E., Oct. 18.—Horticulture Week at the exposition opens on the 21st, with the Palace of Horticulture the scene of violent activity on that date in particular. Five bands will be there, the Hawaiian singers and dancers, Spanish singers and dancers, and at night everybody will dance through the aisles of the palace.

This will be a day of gifts, no less

than 100,000 packages of flower and vegetable seeds being offered to the visitors. Twenty thousand potted ferns will be there for the ladies, and 50,000 dahlias will be distributed. Besides this, apples, prunes, cider and fruit of other kind will be given away.

The fall flower show will be on during Horticulture Week, and it is expected that this will prove one of the exposition's most successful periods.
