# Lane Says Oregon Has Not Been in Any Way Slighted in Actions of Department; More Aid Coming

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 14.—Complaints that Oregon is slighted in the apportionment of the government's fund for reclamation do not tally with a statement by Franklin K. Lane, secretary of the interior, which shows that from 1910 to date \$7,324,616 has been made available by the government for reclamation in Oregon and less than a third of this amount, or \$2,075,368 spent. The sum of \$467,140 has been set aside for reclamation work next year. Secretary Lane's statement is in a letter to C. S. Jackson, publisher of the Journal.

In no sense, he insists, is Oregon being neglected. It is the only state where new reclamation projects have been started under the present administration, except a \$100,000 allotment in Oklahoma. More research and explorative work with reference to new projects is being made in Oregon than in all the other irrigation states combined, and more here than ever before in the history of the reclamation service.

Through much has been done for the development of Crater Lake National park more is proposed. He continues with reference to the Indian service:

"During the past two years \$299,000 was spent in the operation and maintenance of the Indian agencies; \$408,716 was spent in the operation of Indian boarding schools; and \$138,596 on Indian irrigation projects. Altogether, in the past two years, \$1,023,626 was spent by us in connection with the administration of Indian agencies, schools and reservations in Oregon."

He describes the work of the geographic survey in Oregon. "Since July 1 the survey has issued five important bulletins on the water supply of the state and four other reports are in course of preparation. It is estimated that approximately 1,000 square miles of Oregon will be covered by topographic surveys in the state have been thus far over \$300,000."

He discusses the plans for Mount Hood and Crater Lake National park, the latter having been personally inspected by Assistant Secretary Mather last year, then turns to reclamation work:

"Let me say that with the exception of \$100,000 allotted for reclamation work in Oklahoma, we have undertaken no new reclamation work during my administration anywhere except in Oregon. Of course, we have continued work on the projects which were already started, but I am speaking now of new work undertaken."

"In November I allotted \$800,000 for the construction of the west extension of the Umatilla project, and in December, after an agreement with the governor, for expenditures in the construction of a common project in the Deschutes basin I allotted \$450,000 with the understanding that a like sum would be appropriated by the state; and as you know, \$50,000 was allotted for cooperative investigations under a contract with the state."

These allotments were made in 1913 after this administration came into office. "In January, 1914, \$1,232,137 was apportioned from the reclamation fund for expenditure in Oregon, and thus far in 1915, \$316,535 has been allotted. As a further evidence of our interest in reclamation work in Oregon, in our appropriation for 1916 we have asked for \$467,140 for reclamation work within the state. "In making these allotments directions were given to those charged with their expenditure to proceed vigorously, in order that the work might be carried through without delay, and in order to secure the greatest possible benefit to the water users. Why the funds available were not fully utilized I do not know."

The summarized statement of the secretary of the interior shows that Oregon has had appropriated \$7,791,756 since 1910, and has spent \$2,075,368; Washington has been appropriated \$10,272,306 and has spent \$6,475,092; California has been appropriated \$1,380,000,148, and has spent \$672,418. He says: \$308,258 Expended "During two and a half years of this administration fund 17 per cent more money was expended on reclamation projects in Oregon than during the three preceding years. The average annual expenditure for the five years 1910 to 1914, inclusive, was \$354,422. During the first six months of this year \$303,258 was expended."

Secretary Lane's letter concludes: "Finally, with respect to the reclamation fund let me remind you that during the past 18 months more exploration and investigation work has been done in Oregon with a view to the development of new irrigation projects than in all the previous history of the reclamation service, and more than has been done during the same period in all other irrigation states combined."

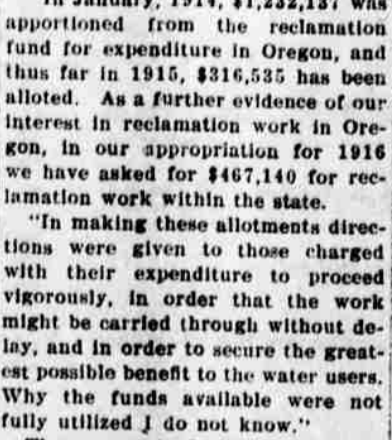

## PEOPLE MAY KEEP AND USE LIQUOR BOUGHT BEFORE DROUTH COMES

REQUIREMENTS FOR PURCHASING LIQUOR IN OREGON AFTER DECEMBER 31 It must be ordered from some dealer outside the state. It must be paid for when ordered. Liquor sent C. O. O. is considered sold within this state. If sent by an express company, it may be delivered, but only to the purchaser in person. The deliveryman must present an affidavit blank, to which the consignee must sign and swear. He must swear that he is the person to whom the liquor is consigned and that he has not received more liquor than the quantity allowed him by law. The expressman may charge 5 cents for the affidavit. No person or no family may receive more than two quarts of spirituous or vinous liquors (whisky, brandy, wine, rum, etc.), nor more than 34 quarts of malt liquors (beer, ale, porter, etc.), within a period of four weeks.—Oregonian, December 3.

District Attorney Says Men May Fill His Basement Before Jan. 1 If He Desires FRIENDS MAY BE SERVED Disposal With Meals or With Hotel Rooms or Other Subterfuge Will Be Considered Bootlegging.

The prohibition law will not interfere with the private use of liquor in the home, according to District Attorney Walter H. Evans. If a man desires to fill his basement with liquor before the clock chimes the hour of midnight on December 31, he may do so and may lawfully drink it at his leisure after the long drouth begins with the coming of the new year.

When he entertains friends at his home he may serve them with the beverages he has stored away without fear of the law, says the district attorney.

"I do not think the prohibition law intended to interfere with the use of liquor privately, so long as there is no indication of an attempt to evade or violate the law," said Mr. Evans today.—Portland Daily Journal, December 2.
