

· It must be paid for when ordered. Liquor sent C. . O. O. is considered sold · within this state. If sent by an express com

pany, it may be delivered, but only to the purchaser in person. The deliveryman must present an afo fidavit blank, to which the o consignee must sign and · swear.

He must swear that he le the person to whom the liquor is consigned and that he has not received more liquor than the o quantity allowed him by

· The expressman may charge 5 cents for the af-· fidavit.

· No person or no family may receive more than two . o quarts of spirituous or vinous liquors (whisky, o o brandy, wine, rum, etc.), o nor more than 34 quarts o of malt liquors (beer, ale. o od of four weeks. Ore o gonian, December 2.

Be Considered Bootle

The prohibition law will not in fere with the private use of liquor in the home, according to District Attorney Walter H. Evans.

If a man desires to fill his basement with liquor before the clo chimes the hour of midnight on December 31, he may do so and may lawfully drink it at his leisure after the long drouth begins with the com

ing of the new year. When he entertains frien home he may serve them with the beverages he has stored away with-out fear of the law, says the district
