War Munition Plants Causing Prosperity

(Special Correspondence)

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 30.—War order corporations, the credit for which Secretary Redfield vainly endeavors to attach to the democratic administration, have multiplied exceedingly during the ten months of the present year ended October last. The most remarkable increase is in the Eastern states, where over forty new companies have been formed to manufacture war munitions, with capital aggregating \$53,935,000. This does not include four large concerns which have recently been forced to new financing in order to accommodate the large rush of business from abroad, whose aggregate capital as a result of this refinancing amounts to \$254,000,000.

Considering these corporations whose capital amounts to \$100,000 or over, eighteen are credited to Delaware, combined capital \$37,150,000. Added to these are the DuPont, De Nemours Co., which is refinanced with \$240,000,000 capital; the Midvale Steel and Ordnance company, capital \$100,000,000, and the DuPont Securities company, with a capital of \$10,000,000.

Fifteen new companies are credited to New York state, combined capital \$4,185,000, added to which is the Submarine Boat corporation, refinanced with a capital of \$4,000,000. In Massachusetts six companies have been formed, combined capital \$10,050,000. In Maine, one, capital \$2,000,000. In New Jersey, three, combined capital \$590,000. The munitions of war to be manufactured and sent abroad by these companies include guns, rifles, ordnance, explosives of all kinds, and aircraft. The organization by means of showing capitalization, is as follows:

So much for the direct results of the European war.

But a number of other corporations have come into being, indirectly as a result of the war. They are the companies which have been organized for the manufacture and distribution of chemicals, drugs and dyes, and which find in the European that protection to American manufacturers and distribution which a free trade democracy denied them.

The records show that of those companies capitalized at \$100,000 or over, fifty-eight have been organized during the ten months ended October last, total capital aggregating \$53,790,000. Here, again, Delaware takes the lead. Twenty-five corporations of this class are credited to this state, combined capital \$35,900,000.

Thirteen are credited to New York, combined capital \$10,860,000. Ten to New Jersey, combined capital \$1,450,000. Three to Pennsylvania, combined capital \$2,800,000. Three to Maine, combined capital \$1,700,000. Two to West Virginia, combined capital \$600,000, and one to Massachusetts, capital \$280,000. Organization by months as follows:

But what part has President Wilson, or Secretary McAdoo, or Secretary Redfield had to do in it? They have merely attempted to hide the real issues behind the European war clouds.

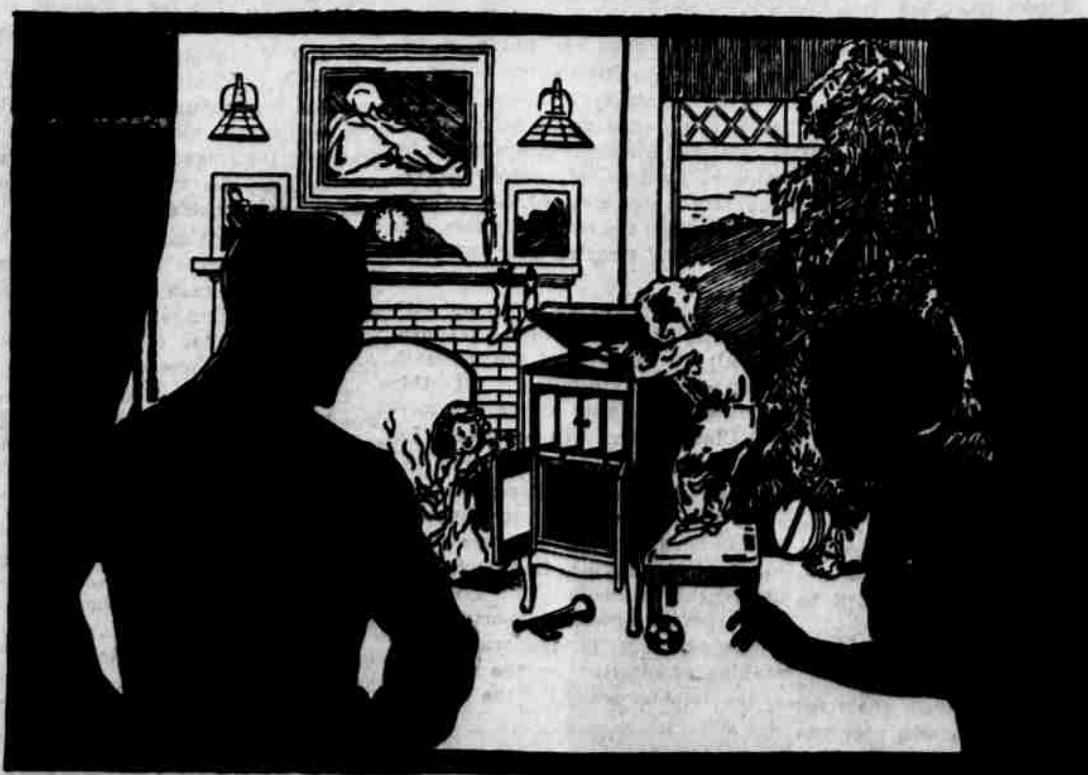

OREGON BOOSTERS TO GATHER IN PORTLAND DECEMBER 31ST, AND AGAIN PUT DEVELOPMENT LEAGUE ON THE MAP.

PORTLAND, Dec. 20.—The meeting for the re-organization of the Oregon Development League will be held on December 31st, immediately following the session of the Oregon Irrigation congress. It is fully expected that many of the delegates to the congress will remain and participate in the deliberations at the league meeting.

In fact the two are so closely allied that we would urge the irrigation delegates to remain for the Friday meeting.

On Thursday evening the Chamber of Commerce will give a banquet to both the irrigation congress and the Development league delegates, at which time prominent speakers will be present to discuss development features.
