REED IS GIVEN \$200 DAMAGE

ACTION ARISING OUT OF OLD LIT-
IGATION, INVOLVING ANCIENT
INJUNCTION IS WON BY THE
PLAINTIFF

After about three hours of deliber-
ation, the jury hearing the Reed-
Brandenburg damage suit last night
returned a verdict awarding \$200
damages to the plaintiff, J. B. Reed.
Brower and Elliott were attorneys for
Reed in the action.

The case is the outgrowth of a suit
between Reed and C. K. Brandenburg
in 1909, at which time Brandenburg
enjoined the sale by Reed of hay
raised on the L. D. Burk ranch near
Bonanza. As a result of the injunc-
tion, Reed held, the hay was allowed
to spoil when it could have been sold
at a good figure to stockmen.
