## BATTLE CRY OF PEACE COMING

KLAMATH FALLS PEOPLE TO SEE WONDERFUL PICTORIZATION OF PREPAREDNESS PLEA—THE PLOT FURNISHED BY MAXIM

## Herald Is Again Chosen County's Official Paper

The Evening Herald was this afternoon designated by the county court as the official newspaper of Klamath county for the year 1938, it having been proven to have the largest number of bona fide subscribers within the county.

The sworn list submitted by the Merrill Record was thrown out and not considered by the court, for the reason that it was fraudulent on the face of it. The falsifying of the purported list of subscribers to the Merrill Record was so evident and intentional the court was forced to conclude it was done for the purpose of attempting to deceive the court in a

vain effort to secure the contract for the county printing.

Nearly a hundred duplications were shown in the list submitted and sworn to. Many names were on the list of persons who have not lived in Klamath county for from six months to three years. Many others, it was sworn by the publisher, were receiving their papers at two different post-offices where the Merrill Record was supposed to be delivered to them, for as long as two and three years. Evidently there were not enough names on the registration list, as the total sworn to was increased by counting the entire list at Midland twice.

The publisher of the Record informed the court that she would appeal from its decision.

## COYOTES IN SACRAMENTO VALLEY ACTING QUEERLY

CHICO, Jan. 27.—Following closely upon the report that numerous coyotes had been seen in the vicinity of Chico, having been driven from the mountains by the recent storms, comes the report that a band of a score of coyotes is roaming in the vicinity of Hamilton City.

It was reported near Head Gate, north of Hamilton City, that some of

the animals had been seen frothing at the mouth and acting very queerly, as if affected with rabies.

Some fear that the varmints have been chased down from the northern counties, where hydrophobia in coyotes has created nearly a reign of terror.

The Greek cruiser Helli and the destroyer Leon, with a strong contingent of troops, have been sent to Samos to cope with an insurrection on that island, said to be due to a lack of food-stuffs.

## FRANZ JOSEF IS REPORTED AS ILL

VATICAN RECEIVES REPORTS THAT EMPEROR HAS SUFFERED TWO STROKES OF APOPLEXY—OTHER WAR NEWS

ROME, Jan. 27.—Diplomats today received reports that Emperor Franz Josef of Austria suffered two strokes of apoplexy, and is in a critical condition.

It is also understood that the vatican has been informed that the aged monarch is sinking rapidly.

BERLIN, Jan. 27.—The Cologne Volks Zeitung declares that Arabs and Turks have combined in an attack on the 20,000 Britishers defending Aden. The English force's position is dangerous.

It is understood that the British have lost 15,000 killed and 20,000 wounded around Aden since the beginning of the war.

According to press dispatches from Germany, new tax bills which will reach the Reichstag in March next will provide for the raising of between \$100,000,000 and \$125,000,000 needed to cover the deficit in the next fiscal year. It is reported the new taxes will not touch articles of ordinary consumption.

HOLD UP BANK CASHIER AND THIRTY OTHERS AND GET OFF WITH BIG SUM OF MONEY—ESCAPE IN AUTO

They got from \$12,000 to \$13,000 and escaped in their auto.
