STRAHORN RUNS A 40-ACRE LINE

WORK OF FIRST SECTION OF PROPOSED LINE BETWEEN BEND AT LAKEVIEW ENDED—PARTY NOW AT PAISLEY

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 1.—The Strahorn engineers have completed permanent survey of forty miles of the proposed Lakeview-to-Bend route of the network of railroads that are to be built in central Oregon, and have established the route from Lakeview as far north as Paisley, was the information received today by Baliff Conser of the county court from his son, E. H. Conser, cashier of the Paisley National bank.

The survey crew is now camped at Paisley, whence they will continue the work north through Summer Lake, Silver Lake and Fremont, until they connect with the line already surveyed some forty miles south from Bend. Towns of central Oregon are preparing for a spring boom, says Cashier Conser.

Snow in the vicinity of Paisley, the Chewaukan valley, is from fifteen to eighteen inches deep. North of Paisley, in the Silver Lake valley and at Summer Lake there is from two to four feet of snow, and in the mountains it is from five to twenty feet deep. This, says the cashier, insures plenty of moisture and good crops next season.
