In the Matter of Raising the Bounty on Coyotes in Klamath County, Oregon.

It appearing to the court that a portion of the county is now infested with wild coyotes, which are affecting the country spreading disease and death among livestock, also menacing the lives of persons living within the county;

And it further appearing that the additional bounty of \$2.00 per head offered by the county by order of the county court dated the 23d day of December, 1915, in effect until April 1, 1916, is not sufficient bounty to insure the killing of said animals; Therefore, it is hereby ordered that there be allowed the sum of \$5.00 bounty on each of said coyotes killed in Klamath county from date hereof, until the first day of March, 1916, in addition to the said bounty of state and county now in effect, and that after said first day of March, 1916, the bounty of \$2.00 by the county, as per above mentioned order of December 23, 1915, shall apply.
