G OVERNMENT reports show that some progress is being made in wishes to call on you. the war being waged against child labor in manufacturing plants, particularly in the South. While the laws are still being evaded they are not being so openly defied. This is one good sign at least.

It is a crime against nature to work little children. The Creator intended that the child should romp and play, and be in the open exercising. It never was intended that children should be dwarfed physically and mentally by being converted into maines to enrich a few wealthy manufacturers.

Men as well as women in every state should lend their efforts to secure better child labor laws, and to see that the laws are enforced literally. Greedy employers will, of course, insist they must have children to perform certain tasks, but it is inhuman to employ young boys and girls in cotton, glass and other factores, and underpay them. They are entitled to protection, and if their families are too poor to afford them that protection, then society must see that it is extended. Enroll as a member of the anti-child labor forces.
