### PEACE RUMORS AGAIN

The old saying that where there is so much smoke there must be fire appears to be applicable to the war in Europe.  
From widely different sources there have recently come rumors that the central powers would welcome overtures from the allies. The new rumors are that Germany has reduced her demands, and that no indemnity will be asked from any power.  
Undoubtedly the people of the central powers are feeling the pinch of hunger. The seasons of 1914 and 1915 were bad for crops, and as there are few laborers left to plant and cultivate crops of any kind, and as the blockade prevents the receipts of foodstuffs, it is plain that the warring countries must be short of food to an alarming extent. The reports are that the women in many places have engaged in riots and have called for peace.  
To the onlooker in this country it would appear as if the time had arrived for the rulers to take stock. The war has been raging for more than a year and a half, and during the past few weeks very little progress has been made. On all fronts there is a practical deadlock, and in all recent attempts to advance the loss of men has been terrible, while the gain in ground has been small and of little strategic importance.  
Last New Year the seers of Europe made the prediction that on April 23d the war would end. It now begins to look as if the seers might be right. If either side were making gains of importance there might be reason to expect the losing side to continue its desperate resistance in a hopeless cause, but as there seems to be an unbreakable deadlock, why not call a halt and return to the paths of civilization?
