ENGLAND PLANS TO BAR THE GERMAN RHODES SCHOLARS

LONDON, March 30.—A bill has been introduced in parliament to change the conditions of the Rhodes Scholarship Trust so as to eliminate endowments for German students at Oxford.

There were fifteen of these scholarships provided by the late Cecil Rhodes of \$50 pounds (about \$1,250) each, nominations to be made by the Kaiser. The endowments, like those to American students, were made in the belief that “a good understanding between England, the United States of America and Germany would secure the peace of the world, and that educational relations form the strongest tie.”

The move to undo Rhodes' work is a tacit admission that, so far as Germany is concerned, his idea, generous as it was, was mistaken.
