SLOW REGISTRATION

HERE are fourteen days in which electors can register for the state and county primaries. There are over 2,000 people, or one-half of the county's voting strength, to be registered.

There is not a great deal of excuse P. W. Synder. for this delay. In every precinct there is a registrar, and the county clerk's itors of the need of registering. But still, only half of the people entitled to vote have qualified themselves for the May balloting.

Next week the clerk's office will remain open a couple of hours in the evenings to accommodate the people whose hours of employment makes it impossible for them to register during the usual business hours at the court house. It is to be hoped that the mill and factory employes will take advantage of this, and register in sufficient strength to make whatever candidates are nominated the choice of the majority of their parties.


