The Philippines produce about 10,000,000 gallons of alcohol a year, most of it being made from the sap of the nipa palm.

The germ theory of the transmission of contagious diseases was entertained as far back as 1657, when the plague ravaged Rome.

The Union of South Africa will build an irrigation dam in the Transvaal that will impound more than 5,000,000 cubic feet of water.

A Virginia inventor's sandpapering machine consists of an endless belt of sandpaper, driven by two drums that are rotated by a treadle.

The handle of a new wire carpet beater is raised several inches from the main shaft to save its user's hand from contact with the carpet.

To enable a student to learn typewriting by the touch system an apron has been invented to be worn around the neck and cover a keyboard.

An English woman has obtained a United States patent for bunks for ships so supported as to remain level no matter how much a vessel rolls.

A record is believed to have been made by a fire engine which pumped water at Superior, Wis., for three months with but five stops for repairs.

To protect automobile tires from puncture there has been invented a small brush to be suspended in front of a wheel to push aside small objects.

The world's largest plant for sterilizing water with ultraviolet rays is being built at Niagara Falls and will have a capacity of 16,000,000 gallons a day.

For saving lives at sea there has been invented a water tight cask in which a person can float indefinitely until rescued, as a valve admits air, and food supplies are carried.

Seaweed offers a prolific source of fuel oil when present supplies are exhausted, according to an English scientist who has obtained seven gallons from a ton of vegetable matter.

Primarily for the use of physicians, a dynamo transformer has been invented in France which will turn out currents of various tensions and strengths at the same time if desired.

Alcohol can be economically manufactured from the refuse of the henequin plant after the sisal hemp is extracted, a process for the purpose having been invented by a Mexican planter.

end much heavier than the front. The envelope points upward and is driven by the propellers. When it is desired to descent, the operation is reversed, the front of the machine being made heavier than the rear.

A system of pulleys through which the suspending ropes pass keeps the car itself at a horizontal position, no matter what the angle of inclination of the envelope may be. A tube rises from the car which is for the purpose of driving air into the two compartments, which are known as balloons.

The two propellers can be rotated by means of a hand wheel and worm gear in a vertical plane, so that their line of thrust can be kept parallel to the horizontal axis of the envelope, no matter what the inclination of the

car. Every portion of the cloth that went into the envelope of this balloon was examined with the aid of a strong light, and wherever the warp or weft threads appeared to be separated or thinner than usual the parts were reinforced, although the cloth was absolutely new.

In the gondola a large margin of safety has been observed, while the balloon, for its size, is said to be more powerfully engined than any now in existence.
