

ROSEBURG TO GET TO CRATER LAKE

DOUGLAS COUNTY AND FOREST SERVICE JOINTLY ENGAGED IN BUILDING HIGHWAY INTO THE KLAMATH WONDERLAND

An important piece of road construction in Douglas county is the cut-off to Crater Lake, which is being built by the United States forest service and the county jointly. When completed, the new road will provide a route from Roseburg to Crater Lake seventy-five miles shorter than the one in use through Grants Pass, and will shorten the distance between Douglas county and Klamath county approximately 128 miles. It will give to Douglas county an outlet into Eastern Oregon, as well as a direct route to Southern Oregon points.

This new road is known as the South Umpqua route. Leaving the Pacific highway, it leads through the South Umpqua Valley into the Cascade mountains.

Jackson county is building a road up the Rogue River to Crater Lake. The South Umpqua road intersects this at Trail, on Rogue River, thus giving Douglas county the benefit of work being done by Jackson county. This enables a division of travel between Medford and Crater Lake River Valley towns through the mere construction and improvement of about twenty-five miles of road.

The South Umpqua road is said to be a practical one, being on a water grade nearly the entire distance. The maximum grade is only 5 per cent.

Diary Tells a Graphic Story of Mexican Trip

COLUMBUS, N. M., April 6.—How

the American soldiers "swore like hell" through lips caked with alkali and impulsively quickened their pace at the sight of a mutilated American's body was told today in the diary of Tracy Mathewson, official photographer of the war department. Mathewson has returned to Columbus with his plates.

Excerpts from the diary follow:
"March 16.—We passed the body of one poor American killed by Villa. The body was lying in the mesquite. Hands cut off and feet horribly burned. The Mexicans had driven their horses over it. The men all swore like hell when they saw it, and seemed to go faster.
"The officers let the body lie, thinking it would have some effect on the men. It did. Two horses with their heads hanging stood by. They are faithful even to the dead, and nearly starved."

"My lips are getting cracked. They become coated with this alkali and when I lick them sores form on my tongue. It is painful, but it is the same with everyone."

"March 19.—Ten horses and mules dropped dead. They just pull out without a sound, then suddenly drop stone dead."

"We passed Colonia Diaz. I believe it is the prettiest place in the world. There was no one in the whole town. About sunset dough-boys were cheering. Looked up and saw a full moon with seven aeroplanes circling against it like a flock of geese. Told of pitiable failure of wireless."

"March 20.—Started another leg of the journey into Mexico and God knows what. Ran into an awful wind and sandstorm. Tied handkerchiefs over nose, mouth. Dust awful. Got
