RESULTS OF CONSTRUCTIVE BONDING

GRANTS PASS bonded itself for \$500,000 to build ten miles of railroad—then presented the railroad as a bonus for an extension a total distance of forty miles to the mineral belt.

These bonds cost the people of Grants Pass \$12,000 a year taxes as interest on the bonds. Let us see some of the results secured by the issuance of these bonds, as claimed by interested parties for this year.

There will be shipped over this railroad from mines which probably would not otherwise be operated 200 cars of copper ore, valued at \$23,000. There will be manufactured 3,000,000 feet of lumber, 400 cars, costing \$8 per 1,000 feet to produce, or \$64,000 payroll for the city.

There will also be cut and shipped 8,000,000 feet of logs, which at \$8 per 1,000, are valued at \$64,000.

There will be cut and shipped 2,000 cars of fuel wood, 40,000 cords, which at \$2 per cord for cutting is \$80,000.

There will be produced from land along the railroad 1,000 acres of sugar beets, or \$40,000.

It is also claimed that the railroad brought the sugar factory, a \$600,000 investment, of which \$300,000 represents labor.

The extension of the road twenty-five miles, at an average cost of \$30,000 per mile, means a \$500,000 investment.

This program of one year's development is due to the new railroad Grants Pass started. Similar development would be recorded elsewhere, if other needed branch railroads were constructed in Southern Oregon.—Medford Mail-Tribune.

Haucourt, Near Verdun, Captured by Germans

LONDON, April 7.—The Germans Wednesday night captured Haucourt, nine miles northwest of Verdun, in a resumption of their offensive on a most tremendous scale. This indicates that the French battles on Hill No. 304, dominating the village, have been heavily damaged by German siege guns in their systematic bombardment.

Paris claims "frightful German losses." The Germans claim the capture of 542 men.

United Press Service PARIS, April 7.—It is officially admitted that the Germans reached Haucourt Wednesday night after a series of assaults to the northwest of Vaux. The Haucourt advance was offset by the French capture of an important German position in the Caures woods.

German attacks against Bethincourt have been repulsed.

United Press Service LONDON, April 7.—Lord Derby, who made a whirlwind campaign for volunteer recruits before the conscription bill passed, has resigned as chairman of the British Aerial Defense committee, according to the newspapers.

An unarmed Norwegian vessel was sunk in the channel, and four of its crew perished.

One person was killed and eight injured in a Zeppelin raid Wednesday night, the fifth within a week. Three Zeppelins participated, and it is believed that one was hit. Forty bombs were dropped by the raiders.
