They met the Americans with a harmless, scattering volley. Those unable to reach their horses scurried into the tall grass like rabbits. Lost in the dense undergrowth and the rocky arroyos they quickly escaped. A few mounted bandits spurred south into San Antonio canyon, the negroes of the Tenth pursuing them fifty miles, until the last Mexican was lost to view.

This was the first encounter in which the negro troops figured. Manuel Iaca, Villa's lieutenant, was reported among those slain.

O.-C. LAND GRANT STILL IN COURT

APPEAL FROM A DECISION BY WOLVERTON IS TO BE HEARD IN FEDERAL CIRCUIT APPEALS COURT NEXT MONTH

PORTLAND, April 10.—Although congress already is legislating to dispose of 3,300,000 acres of Oregon lands under the Oregon-California land grant, the government's title to the lands is not yet completely clear.

On May 8th the United States court of appeals in San Francisco will hear the case. It was appealed by the railroad company after Federal Judge Wolverton in Portland had decided that the railroad had violated the terms of the grant, and had only \$2.50 an acre interest in the vast tract.

The day following, May 9th, the same court will hear an appeal of the case of the United States against the Southern Oregon company. This case is similar to the Oregon-California land grant case. It involves approximately 90,000 acres in Coos and Curry counties.
