S. F. MAN CHARGED WITH DUAL LIFE

PROMINENT ATTORNEY'S BODY
FOUND WITH THAT OF WOMAN
CLAIRVOYANT, WHO CAUSED
THE DEATH OF BOTH

SAN FRANCISCO, April 20.—Timothy Lyons, a prominent probate attorney, and Ida Diamond, a clairvoyant, were found dead today in the woman's room. The woman left letters addressed "to whom it may concern," regarding Lyons and herself, charging the attorney led a life like unto Stevenson's "Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde."

The police believe the woman arose in the night, wrote the letters, and after stuffing rags and papers in the doors and crevices, turned on the gas. Lyons evidently awoke, found himself suffocating, and died trying to escape. Lyons was a member of several well known clubs, and was also prominent in political circles.

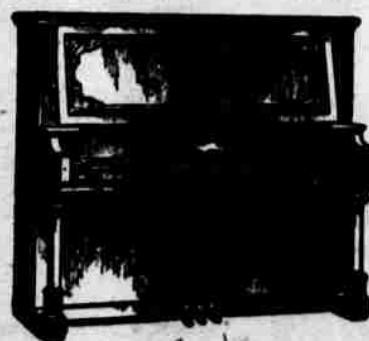

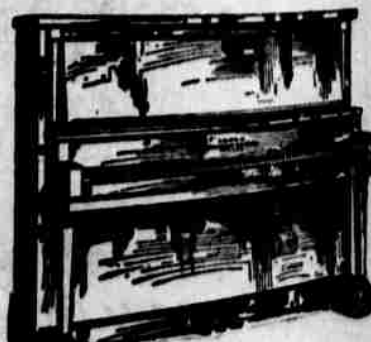
