### SKIRMISHING ON IN CHICAGO AND **NATION WATCHES**

BULL MOOSERS ARE STILL BEING WATCHED

Ready to Support Candidate With Progressive Principles-Republican is Settling Contests the Southern Delegations

CHICAGO, June 1.-George W Perkins today announced that the progressive party still intends to support any candidate advocating progressive principles.

"The conventions should be for America first, and party afterwards," said he. "Carransa's latest note accuses the administration of misleading the Mexican government. This is the first time a foreign power has ever dared to accuse Uncle Sam of treachery, and our prime object should be to stop this sort of thing and restore our good name."

Chairman Hilles of the republican national committee said he believes the progressives and republicans will unite. He denies the report that the committee, at a meeting today, planned to name a compromise candidate.

Hotel lobby talk today indicated the formation of a combine against Hughes by anti-Hughes republicans and Roose velt republicans. Roosevelt's secre tary said today that Roosevelt is "most surely" a candidate.

The republican committee is hearing forty contests affecting sixty-two Southern delegates. Hilles says these are mainly technical fights for state control.
