LOCAL MAN GETS WINDMILL PATENT

A. CARLSON'S INVENTION IS DECLARED A BIG SELLER, AND MANUFACTURE OF THESE HAS GREAT PROSPECT FOR SUCCESS

A factory for the manufacture of a new patent windmill is the latest industrial possibility for Klamath Falls.

This invention has been patented by A. Carlson, a well known local mechanic, who has already started manufacturing on a small scale. As soon as the superiority of this new mill has been demonstrated to the farmers of this section, it is the intention of Mr. Carlson to erect a plant and begin manufacturing on a larger scale.

The invention is a new kind of wind mill. Its working parts are entirely different from other makes, and it is automatically regulated by a new kind of rudder, operating parallel with the wheel. The rudder can be adjusted so as to regulate the speed of the wheel, and in an unusually strong wind the rudder shifts and the brake is applied automatically, but as soon as the velocity of the wind subsides to safe working speed, the wheel goes into normal operating position again.

The wheel is self-oiling in all parts. No oil is wasted, and no dust or sand can get into the working parts. One of the main features of the invention is the gearing and driver parts for the pumping rod. It consists of a simple and strongly constructed internal gear, on which more patents are pending, which forms the turntable and supports for the wind mill wheel. The mill operates absolutely noiselessly, and there is no waste motion or power.

The mills can be made in sizes from six to twenty feet, with strokes from six inches to four feet, and are designed for deep well pumping and irrigating and drainage work. Mr. Carlson has erected a good-sized model of mill for demonstration purposes.
