BANKS AND POSTOFFICE ARE CLOSED IN OBSERVANCE OF ANNIVERSARY — PATRIOTIC PROGRAM TONIGHT

In observance of the anniversary of the adoption of the Stars and Stripes by congress as the national flag, flags are flying from all local flagstaffs and are displayed in front of homes and business houses today. The postoffice and banks are closed in observance.

CATHEY MAY BE CALLED IN CASE

BLOOD TEST ORIGINATED BY LOCAL DOCTOR MAY BE USED IN EFFORT TO UNRAVEL MURDER MYSTERY

In the hope of shedding further light upon the mystery surrounding the killing of Mrs. Frank Jennings at her home near Sherwood, and the murder of Fred Ristman, the chauffeur whose body was found nearby, Portland authorities are considering calling for the services of Dr. George A. Cathey of this city, who originated a test for proving the presence of human blood. An undershirt, washed a few days after the crime by Bennett Thompson, a suspect, was given a blood test by Bertillon Expert Hunter of Portland. Spots indicating blood were found.

Later, another test was made with a different form of reaction. In order to get an expert opinion on this matter, the Northern officials are seriously considering sending the garment to Dr. Cathey for examination. Cathey was called upon many times while in Portland to make this blood test in connection with criminal affairs. Since coming here, he made use of his blood test in the unravelling of the McLeod murder near Midland, for which Frank Williams is serving a life term in the penitentiary. Bloodstains were discovered by this means upon weapons, utensils and other things at the McLeod homestead. Cathey's blood test system is being effectively used in all of the big cities in police work. The system was used by Arthur B. Reeves as a theme for one of his famous "Craig Kennedy, Scientific Detective" stories.

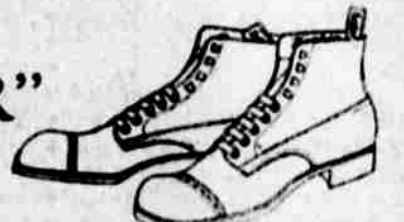
