WASHINGTON, June 23.-The House of Representatives today adopted the May resolution empowering the president to use the state militia in The two socialist members of congress voted no.

The May resolution providing \$50 a menth for the families of militiamen massed unanimously The latter bill carried a \$1,000,000 appropriation. It includes mainte-

nance of families dependent upon militiamen's salaries. Secretary of War Baker today ordered every department commander to

send the militia forces to the border as soon as they are equipped. It is efficially learned that America has asked Great Britain to take

charge of the American consulates in Mexico in the event of hostilities. American consuls are still stationed at the seacoast towns. Many of the interior conouls have departed.

CLACKAMAS, June 23.—The Oregon National Guard was mustered into federal service today. Company M, of Salem, was the first to take the oath. Every man in the company passed the examination.

Officers expect to have all mustering details attended to tenight.


