COLLECT RELICS OF INDIAN WARS

Rutenic and Yaden are to collect the relics for the museum of the Klamath Historical Society. The society has been offered space in the city hall, and will establish its museum there. The public may view the museum at any time.

Captain Rutenic states that the historical society will be very thankful for contributions of Indian relics from any one having any. Relics may be left at his office in the First National bank building.

MAY BOND CITY FOR TERMINAL

LAKEVIEW EXPECTS TO VOTE BONDS TO PURCHASE TERMINAL FOR STRAHORN RAILROAD. AWAITS STRAHORN VISIT

LAKEVIEW, July 12.—Asking the city council to call an election to bond the city for \$10,000 to purchase the necessary rights of way and a site for a terminal for the Oregon, California & Eastern railroad, a petition has received over 500 signatures and presented for action.

The members of the city council decided to await the visit of Robert E. Strahorn, president of the company, to receive assurances the railroad will be built before going to the expense of a bond election. Strahorn is expected in a few days.

The Oregon, California & Eastern railroad has nearly completed surveys and obtained many rights of way for several roads through Southeastern Oregon and Modoc and Lassen counties of California. Branches will be extended to Klamath Falls and Lakeview with connecting lines. The purpose of the enterprise is to give Southern Oregon more direct connection with Portland, and to connect the Hill system, which has been built to Bend, Ore., with other the Western Pacific or Southern Pacific in Lassen county, California.

Japanese Officer Writes of the Kaiser's Dreams

LONDON, June 25.—(By wire)—On seeing this war letter from a Japanese officer in a London paper today a British war correspondent suggested that German's defeat is certain if it ever gets tangled up in it. The letter, undeleted, is to fact-touched:
"Kaiser have said on earliest beginning of great war, I capture Paris in three weeks, then I wipe the feet of my glorious army on Calais, I will steam roller on the contemptible John

French army and then I shall make invasion of the English. In three weeks Crown Prince Willie and myself shall eat sauerkraut and pigs-sausage in the Paris best hotel. Most enjoyable prospect. But Kaiser has done nothing of these things, the pigs-sausage is not eaten, Calais is still in allies hands and the contemptible John French army grows by expansion every day.
"Kaiser has jumped on the conclusion. He tells to himself that France is weak, and England is most perfidious. Kaiser has not looked to find if there is a hole in his ship. If Kaiser had looked enough he would have find very big hole indeed and that hole is called 'Ally Hole' and 'British navy.' French nation is not weak as Kaiser thought, England refuse to become perdidy for his benefits. Russians are not heated.

"Now two whole years are nearly fled away, and German Kaiser has a gray head, but he is not conqueror of allies. Kaiser has victory in Poland and in Belgium for the present, but where is German colony? General Smuts and General Botha have stole away his Africa possessions. Germany have begun great war for very special reasons. Chief reason was to have more colony and to have big piece of China and Germans have not made the achievement of any colony at all. How lone more will Kaiser sacrifice his soldiers? Allies can find time to wait until Hun has no more insides for the fighting, but Hun must make his object or be heated. What is for Kaiser to do? If he make attack he will be heated most exceedingly bad. On the other foot if Kaiser is to sit down and become defenseless than what gain Kaiser?

"In Japan we know Kaiser is heated. Sensible Japanese man say, 'Great war last one whole year more, perhaps one and a half year, but no longer can last. If Hun is not heated by that time then Kaiser will make surrender himself.' That is ration thinking. One thing of England is most disgusting. The objector of conscience to fight England is much too good country for them. Even Hun have scorn on English to produce such man. Objector of conscience is most certainly traitor to English king and country. How much disgusting these men are to honorable English."

CALL TO COLORS PRODUCES JOBS

EXTENSIVE EMPLOYMENT OF WOMEN IN CHICAGO TO FILL THE PLACES LEFT BY MEN IS CONSIDERED PROBABLE

CHICAGO, July 12.—Whatever the effect may have been on other cities, the mobilization of the American military finds Chicago facing a serious skilled and unskilled labor shortage today. The extensive employment of women in what heretofore have been exclusively masculine fields is not considered improbable nor remote.

Labor employment bureaus are swamped with demands for male help of all kinds. Want ad columns are jammed with offers of jobs. More than 1,000 regular manual labor jobs are waiting for men to take them. Almost an equal number of skilled labor jobs are open. The demand for office assistants, managers, clerks and men of trades is far in excess of the supply. Hundreds of first class jobs have gone begging ever since Uncle Sam's call for state troops took the militiamen from their benches, desks and offices, and the prosecution of regular business in many instances seriously has been interfered with.

BAKER COUNTY IS SEEKING \$15,000

DISTRICT ATTORNEY IS AUTHORIZED TO SUE THE STATE FOR THIS AMOUNT FOR RECEIPTS FROM NATIONAL FORESTS

BAKER, July 12.—District Attorney Godwin was authorized by the county court to bring suit against Secretary of State Olcott for approximately \$15,000, alleged due the school and road funds of Baker county as the county's share of receipts of the Minam and Whitman national forests since 1908.

It is alleged that moneys from national forests were not distributed by the secretary of state in accordance with federal law of 1906, and that by failure to make distribution in proper manner this county has been "short changed" in the amount noted. Other counties of Eastern Oregon entitled to share in national forest receipts are considering similar suits, and may cooperate in bringing them.
