KLAMATH FALLS IS READY FOR FREE DELIVERY

LAST OBSTACLE SAID TO BE RE MOVED

Postmaster Delzell Believes That Im proved Mail Service Removes Last Straw in the Way of Free Delivery. Portoffice Inspector Has Given O. K. to House Numbering

With mails arriving in Klamath Falls and leaving twice each day, it is now believed that no valid argument stands in the way of free mail delivery for this city. Some time ago a postoffice inspector was here and sent in his approval of the business house and esidence numbering For several years the receipts at the local postoffice have been more than enough to varrant establishment of a free de-

The objection on which the post fice department has stood out longnot granting free delivery to Klamath Palls is that free delivery sould delay the time of patrons getting by 9:30 or 10 o'clock the same night,

Letters From Congressman Sinnott and Chief Forester's Assistant Show That Oregons Interest in the \$1,000, 000 Nationa' Park Fund is Being Looked After in Washington

That the appeals from various sources in Oregon for a just proportion of the \$1,000,000 to be set aside annually for improvement of roads in na tional forests are being listened to in Washington is indicated in letters received this marning by Klamath Commercial Clug from Congressman Sinnott and A. F. Potter, acting forester. Following is the letter from Mr.

"I have received your wire of July 11. The forest service is now engaged in preparing rules and regulations for carrying out section 8 of the federal aid road act approved by the president on July 11. It is the intention to subgated at an early date.

"The district forester at Portland, Oregon, has been requested to prepare a list of recommended projects in order of their importance, and to inform me regarding the amount of co-operation which probably will be available. He is well acquainted with the road situation in Klamath county, and I know will consider its needs when he is preparing his list of projects."
