BRYAN TREATY TO MAKE US BEHAVE

SECRETARY LANSING WILL NEGOTIATE TO OBTAIN MODIFICATION OF TRADE BLACKLISTING BY ENGLAND

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 20.—The Bryan arbitration treaty with Great Britain may prevent for a year any retaliatory measures by the United States because of the blacklisting by the English government of certain American firms. The blacklisting is deprecated in Washington. Secretary of State Lansing is expected at once to negotiate with England, seeking a modification of the blacklisting. Lansing today formally requested the British embassy here to furnish fuller information regarding the blacklisting.

50 DIE EACH DAY FROM STARVATION

REFUGEES SAY CONSUL GENERAL AT VERA CRUZ HAS ORDERED ALL AMERICANS TO LEAVE MEXICO SOON AS POSSIBLE

RUSSIAN MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS WILL CONSIDER REQUEST TO FEED STARVING POLISH PEOPLE

STEEL BRIDGE AT CHILOQUIN

ORDER CALLS FOR \$3,000 STRUCTURE TO REPLACE OLD BRIDGE OVER THE WILLIAMSON RIVER NEAR SPRAGUE JUNCTION

Work is to commence soon on a \$3,000 steel bridge over the Williamson River at Chiloquin, according to Engineer H. W. Hincks, who is to superintend the construction of the bridge. The new bridge is to take the place of the old one at Chiloquin, and will be built in the same place.

The order for the new bridge brings the total expenditure to be made on new construction on the reservation this year to \$31,000, as \$28,000 is to be spent for irrigation work.
