STANFORD UNIVERSITY, Calif. Aug. 21.-Women students are much better in scholarship than men, and non-fraternity men better than fraternity men, according to statistics recently announced by the registrar of

Of the whole body of women students, only 2.5 per cent were given their first failure or dismissal during the last school year. Four per cent of the sorority girls and only 1 per cent of the non-sorority girls were given their first failure or dismissal.

Sixteen per cent of all the men stulents at the university were given their first failure or dismissal, while 21 per cent of fraternity men and only 5 per cent of non-fraternity men were in this class.

schollarship among the men is getting poorer, too. Last year's percentage of failures or dismissals was higher than the previous year, when 16 per cent of the fraternity men and 13 per cent of non-fraternity men received their first failure or dismissal.

Last year's figures are higher than any previous year at the university.
