

GOVERNOR WITHYCOMBE SAYS HIGHWAY COMMISSION WILL TRY TO MEET KLAMATH DELE-GATION SEPTEMBER 1ST.

Indication that the state highway commission will be glad to see the Klamath delegation that is to appear before it in the interest of the proposed Florence-Eugene-Klamath Falls highway is contained in the following letter from Governor Withycombe by the Klamath Commercial Club:

"This is in acknowledgement of your letter of August 14th, in which you ask thatt he state highway com mission arrange to hold a meeting with the delegation from Klamath county on September 1st.

"Your letter has been referred to Mr. John H. Lewis, state engineer, with the request that if possible arrangements be made with the other members of the commission to meet with your delegation at that time.
