

REMOVE TROOPS AT PEACE MEET

ARMY OFFICIAL DECLARES THAT
PERSHING'S TROOPS WILL STAY
IN MEXICO UNTIL JOINT COM-
MISSION MEETS

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 22.—An official high in the service of the army today declared that the American troops in Mexico under General Pershing will not be withdrawn until the joint American-Mexican peace commission meets.

It is reported that the American members of the commission have recommended this action.

It is believed that the militiamen will leave for home at the same time, leaving the regular troops to guard the border.

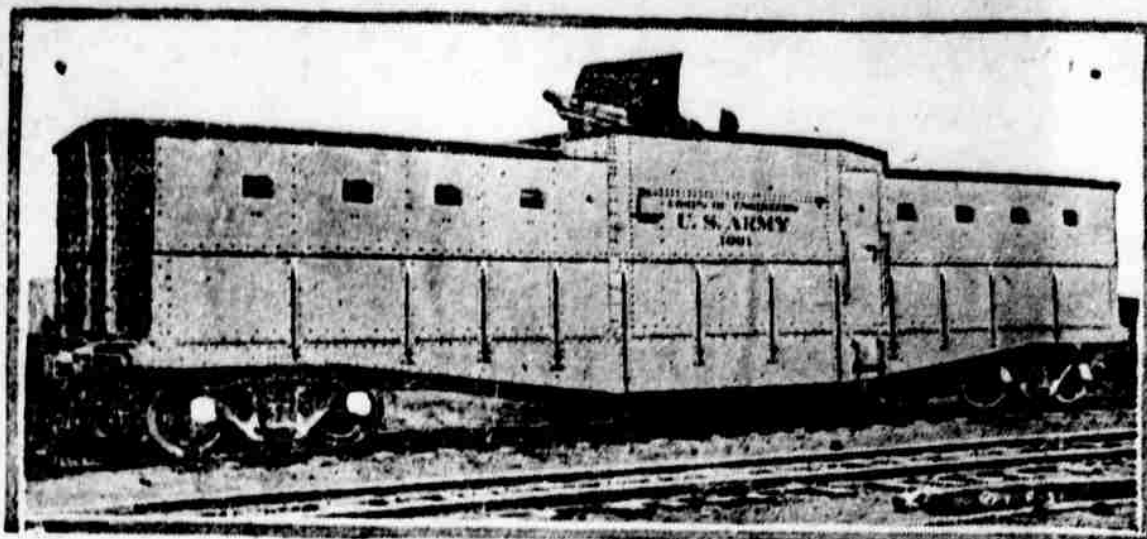

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Uncle Sam Buys an Armored Car at Last



This is the first of a special design of armored cars just delivered to the war department by a Hammond (Ind.) car building company. The car is built of light steel plates, and will carry one high-powered gun, mounted in a gun carriage at the top center. There are also ports for twenty machine guns on both sides, which may also be used by sharpshooters.

Farm Credits Conference Seeks Check Large Waste

CHICAGO, Aug. 22.—How to check the billion dollar waste in the marketing of farm products will be the dominant theme of the fourth national conference on marketing and farm credits, called today to meet in Chicago December 4 and 5.

Farmers of all states are expected to unite in a discussion of ways and means to remedy a condition termed "wasteful and iniquitous in the extreme" by the committee in its meeting notice.

Surveys will be made prior to the winter gathering that will show the movement of crops such as livestock, grain, cotton and hay.

The whole milk problem and its relation to city distribution will be worked out.

Practical plans will be drawn for eliminating waste, improving farm products and increasing the consumption of certain farm crops.

Half of the conference work will be devoted to rural credits and the federal farm loan act will come for its share of criticism.

"The delegates will analyze the scope and limitations of the act," said Secretary Charles W. Holman of Madison, Wisconsin, today. "And when they are through the American farmer will know what to expect under its terms. Contrary to the general belief this act does not solve the rural credit problem. It is a beginning, but a crude one. It may prove to be almost inoperative in a number of states where federal jurisdiction will clash with existing homestead laws.

"Nor does the act touch even remotely the question of personal credit."

ERICSSON WILL HAVE MEMORIAL

INVENTOR OF MONITOR, TERMED
A "CHEESEBOX ON A RAFT,"
WILL BE REMEMBERED BY THE
NATION

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 22.—Fifty-four years after his epochal "cheesebox on a raft" rescued the Union navy from utter destruction, John Ericsson, inventor of the historic Monitor of Civil War days, is to have a memorial erected to him here, it seems certain.

A bill for a \$100,000 memorial has passed the house, and with strong backing is awaiting action in the senate. Swedish-American societies are urging the bill, and expect its passage at this session. It developed in the house library committee's hearing that the United States owes Ericsson or his heirs an acknowledged debt, the interest on which, if compounded at 4 per cent, would exceed the sum to be appropriated for his memorial.

Efforts to collect this money have been discontinued as useless, however.

60 VILLISTAS ARE DEFEATED

ROUTED BY CARRANZISTAS IN
BATTLE FRIDAY SIXTY MILES
FROM CHIHUAHUA CITY—ARMY

COUNT OKUMA IS NOW A MARQUIS

THE EMPEROR AT WAR CEREMONIES RECENTLY

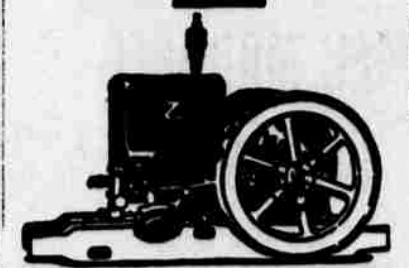

The event was made a national holiday, celebrated by all the cities in Japan.

O. T. McKendree of Lakeview, a well known livestock dealer, is spending a few days in Klamath.

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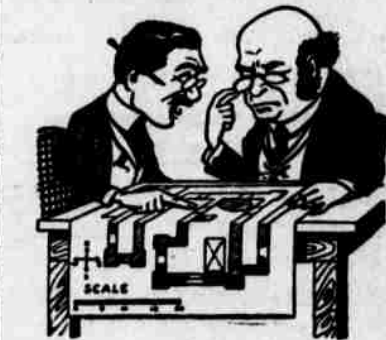

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South America Resents England's Blacklisting

BUENOS AYRES, Argentine, Aug. 22.—South Africans resent the British blacklist as much as the United States does. There is today pronounced ill feeling between the Buenos Ayres Commercial and Corn Exchanges and the British government.

Early in the war the authorities in London began issuing lists of German concerns in foreign countries, Argentine included, with which Englishmen in the same countries were forbidden to have business relations. These lists have been added to from time to time. The two big Buenos Ayres exchanges took official notice of this situation to the extent of recognizing that the British and German interests in question could not meet on a common footing.

This was an embarrassment to the Germans and a convenience to the English, inasmuch as it obliterated com-

plications in transactions which immediately or incidentally involved Argentine and numerous other foreign houses in transactions it might have been difficult, otherwise, to have identified as of a distinctly Anglo-German character.

In the last few weeks, however, the British government has observed that companies of friendly alien origin frequently do business on one side with German and on the other with British companies. An order was accordingly issued from London placing all such establishments on the blacklist.

The Buenos Ayres Commercial and Corn exchanges have gone formally on record as recognizing no such mandate. The result will be practically to nullify the British blacklist in Argentine, except in the cases of the British houses that are disposed to respect it voluntarily. Even the ones in this latter class can hardly respect their government's order without ruining their business, as they have now no longer any guarantee that they will not be trading directly with Germans.

Matrimony Causes Insanity in Ohio
