MACKENBEN ADVANCES ALONG 48-MILE PRONT

Fighting is Turned, Says Vicuna. Rumanian Right Wing Is Crushed by Halgarisms, Who Advance to Within Six Miles of Important

RERIAN, Oct. 23 .- General Von Mackensen this afternoon captured Constanza Military officers high in the German general steff declare this victory is of more importance that all the gains of the Allies in the Somme fighting.

It is indicated in reports received today that the Slave have been routed disastrously in the last two days in a 12-mile advance from Tusia.

Herstofore the Russians have been seading treops and supplies to Rumania through Constausa. Its capture by the Germans cuts off all chance to gend relaforcements via the Black Lea.

The Teutons are now advancing to capture the remainder of the Constanza-Cernavoda ratircad and Cernavoda itself.
