

THE RURAL SCHOOL TERM

(U. S. Department of Education)
WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—School attendance is an essential factor in the actual length of the school term. Prior to 1890 only twentyseven States and the District of Columbia had compulsory school laws and many of these were optional and therefore inoperative.
