## DECEMBER 5, 1916

To the Voters of Klamath Falls;

The following are some of the reasons that you should vote for the franchise permitting the Keno Power Co. to enter the local field in competition with the California and Oregon Power Co.;

(1) It will bring to Klamath Falls genuine competi-tion in electric service for at least fifty years, as the fran-chise of the Keno Power Co. will be non-salable without the consent of the City Council.

(2) It will bring to Klamath Falls a rate for electric service based on actual construction costs and not on a high purchased value which the California and Oregon Power Co. are laboring under.

(3) It will bring to Klamath Falls an additional 1800 horse power for immediate use, while the company has available for future development over ten thousand horse power of water now going to waste. If the franchise is not passed at this election, the City of Klamath Falls will lose forever the use of this cheap power which will be diverted to other fields drawing the users of large blocks of power away from Klamath Falls.


