

# French War Village is Like an American Town

WITH THE CANADIAN ARMY IN FRANCE, Dec. 21—Here in a village so near the front that the thunder of guns is audible day and night, a town that is under bombardment almost

daily, one could easily imagine being in a Canadian or American city badly bombed by an invading enemy.

Even the French street names have been changed to English. English is heard everywhere. The shop signs are in that language. The whole atmosphere of the village has been changed.

As one walks down what was once Rue de Centre, one discovers that the thoroughfare is now called Market street. Over a sign on a building saying "Patinoire," a new one says simply "Ice and Cakes." The cafes announce in English signs, "Meals at All Hours of the Day and Night." One tea place catering to the Canadian Tommies advertises "Five o'Clock Tea at All Hours"—same meaning tea at all hours.

Though the buildings are badly shattered, scarcely one being unscathed by shells, many of the stores are doing a brisk business, for the Canadian Tommies are good spenders. Though the best food soldier on earth, he still buys much fancy food. So it happens that English and American brands of canned and preserved foods of an exotic nature are for sale everywhere.

In given the shops an air of being American groceries. American and Canadian newspapers come here regularly. Any stray newspaper picked up on a vacant lot is almost always an American or Canadian one. A paper pasted over a window frame, the pages of which have been destroyed by concussion of the shells, I saw a Toronto newspaper. One sheet was a sporting page dated September 23, which carried a half-tone cut with the caption, "Greener Alexander, the Kingpin Pick-up of the National League, Who Has Won Twenty-nine Games and Lost Ten for the Philadelphia Champions This Year." Another picture had underneath it, "Hal Chase of Cincinnati, the Leading Batter of the National League," and still another, "George Hallings, Nunch Player of the Boston Braves." The atmosphere of these battle zone towns in the Canadian section is entirely American. Were a blindfolded person taken here and suddenly released he could easily believe that America was being invaded and that war was going on there.
