

LLOYD GEORGE HEAD GROWING

ENGLISH PHRENOLOGIST SAYS
MEASUREMENTS ON BRITISH
PREMIER SHOWS BRAIN DEVELOPMENT
ENLARGES HEAD.

LONDON, Dec. 16.—(By mail)—Lloyd George's head is a growing situation. Professor J. Millett Severn, a consulting phrenologist, examined the British premier's head back in 1903, and found it to measure nearly thirty-three inches around the "per-



ceptives." A later examination showed that the lapse of years had increased the circumference more than a quarter of an inch.

"This goes to prove that as the mind is exercised the brain and head are subject to a larger development," said Professor Severn. "This growth can continue after the subject has reached adult age."

When he examined Lloyd George's head the second time Severn told the present premier of the development. His judgement was borne out by the man who makes the leader's hats. He said Lloyd George was taking a larger bonnet than before.

Severn has not had an opportunity to examine the premier's head since the new cabinet was formed.

RUSH FOR IDAHO LAND HAS BEGUN

LAND AVAILABLE FOR ENTRY IN
LEWISTON DISTRICT, 100,000
ACRES, EXPECTED TO BE GONE
IN ABOUT A YEAR

LEWISTON, Idaho, Jan. 6.—As the result of the passage by congress of the stock raisers' 640-acre homestead act, there was a rush of entrymen at the Lewiston United States land office yesterday. Land office officials were advised by telephone Saturday by Commissioner of the General Land Office Tallman that the law was in effect, but all entries will be suspended pending adoption of rules for classification.

The new law supplements the 320-acre act and applies to land not adapted to agricultural or horticulture and not principally valuable for timber. It is estimated that there are 100,000 acres of such land in the Lewiston land district, and the officials here predict that all will be entered during the year. The law requires that on such land improvements to the extent of \$125 an acre must be made, one-half of this outlay to be made within three years.

In such a civilization where its effects were most apparent, the darkest and most horrible tragedy of all time has been committed and which continues with its horrors unabated. What can it mean?

Accused in Leak Probe in House

This question comes with double force for the reason that the public mind was, prior to this war, being educated to expect peace. The great peace movement which was international, and having its headquarters at The Hague, was loudly singing the anthems of peace.

We were being taught that we would never have another great war, for many reasons; such as the implements of destruction being too deadly to face, and civilization having advanced past the fighting stage. That we were entering the age of the "Brotherhood of Man" and "Peace and Good Will on Earth" were proclaimed louder and louder, until suddenly our voices were drowned by the roar of the cannon, and we turned and looked with amazement upon fields red with human blood.

We are shown by this that: "The wisdom of this world is foolishness with God." 1 Cor. 3:19. But turning to God's Word, we find this condition fully portrayed. In I. Thess. 5:1-3, we read: "But of the times and seasons, brethren, ye have no need that I write unto you. For yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so cometh as a thief in the night. For when they shall say 'Peace and safety,' then sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child, and they shall not escape."

Again, the Lord tells more definitely what the "Peace and safety cry" would be. Micah, 4:1-3. "But in the last days it shall come to pass that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established in the top of the mountains, and it shall be exalted above the hills; and people shall flow into it. And many nations shall come and say, Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, and to the house of the God of Jacob; and he will teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths; for the law shall go forth of Zion, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. And he shall judge among many people, and rebuke strong nations afar off. And they shall beat their swords into plowshares and their

spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more."

Has not God here foretold the exact conditions that prevailed at the outbreak of the war? Have not "many nations" come to the international Hague peace councils? Have not these movements been fostered by the church? Have they not been seriously talking of disarmament? Did not ex-Secretary of State Mr. Bryan literally have swords cast into miniature plowshares as peace emblems to send to nations signing international peace treaties? This expresses that "nation shall not lift up sword against nation any more."

The Lord makes the nations responsible for this movement, as you will notice by the expression quoted above, "And many nations shall come and say," it shall not be the Lord.

In the prophecy of Joel, chapter 3, verse 9, and continuing, the Lord tells what conditions will be. "Proclaim ye this among the Gentiles; prepare war, wake up the mighty men, let all the men of war draw near; let them come up. Beat your plowshares into swords and your pruning hooks into spears; let the weak say I am strong."

By comparing "Put ye in the sickle for the harvest is ripe," from Joel 3:13, with, "The harvest is the end of the world," from Matt. 13:39, it is seen that this prophecy with the other two all point to the "last days," and we easily grasp the truth that they have met definite fulfillment. Surely, no more war preparation could easily be imagined than has taken place in the last quarter century, which is the complete fulfillment of Joel 3:9, as quoted above.

As if these wonderful prophecies were not sufficient, the Lord gave another through John, the Revelator, Rev. 11:18. "And the nations were angry, and thy wrath is come, and the time of the deal that they should be judged, and that thou shouldst give reward unto thy servants, the prophets and to the saints, and shouldst destroy them which destroy the earth."

Are not the nations angry? Are they not destroying the earth? Have they not talked "peace" and "prepared war"? Has not destruction suddenly overtaken them?

Then let us take God's Word as our chart and compass.

BEND, Jan. 6.—Under the direction of a committee composed of C. V. Silvis, R. W. Sawyer and A. J. Kroenert, work is being pushed to secure terminal sites and a right of way for the Strahorn railroads, as an inducement for the proposed lines to center at Bend.

The committee has \$35,000 at its disposal, turned over by the city after the sale of municipal bonds. Members of the committee were named by Mayor S. C. Caldwell, who with Councilmen Louis Bennett, A. E. Edwards and E. P. Bresterhouse, began the first day of their term as city officials January 3rd.
