Houses Are Washed From Foundations and Persons Rescued in Boats When Levee on Oakland Estuary Gives Way-Boys Are Believed Drowned Because Last Seen Asleep in Shed Now Covered With Water.

ALAMEDA, Jan. 9.-Two boys are believed drowned, traction service has been halted and millions of dollars of property is jeopardized by the break this morning in the northern levee protecting the municipal reclamation project on the Oakland estuary side.

A quarter of a mile of factory site land is inundated, and 500 men are at work repairing buildings damaged and the levee itself.
