### IN THE NATIONAL FORESTS GIVEN

PORTLAND, Jan. 12.—Secretary on has announced the amount altted to each state from the million dollars to be spent during the fiscal trails within or partly within the na-tional forests. This money is part of the \$10,000,000 appropriated by the federal aid road act to assist development of the national forests, which bees available at the rate of \$1,000,-000 a year for ten years.

The allotments as approved are as follows: Alaska \$46,354, Arizona 358,-604, Arkansas \$9,803, California \$140,-688, Colorado \$62,575, Idaho \$108,750. Montana \$70,042, Nevada \$19,296, New Mexico \$42,495, Oregon \$128,111, South Dakots \$5.092, Utah \$31,167, Washington, \$91944, Wyoming \$40.684. A total of \$9,995 has been allotted to Florida, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota and Oklahoma. The group of Eastern states, Georgia, Maine, New Hampshire, North and South Carolina esee, Virginia and West Virginia -in which the government is purchasing lands for national forests, receives \$21,120.

In making allotments it is explained 10 per cent of the amount available for 1918 is withheld as a contingent fund. One half of the remainder has been apportioned among the states in amounts based on the area of the national forest lands in each state, while the other half has been allotted on a basis of the estimated vriue of the timber and forest resources which the forests con-
