Hospital Practically Secured
BEND, Jan. 15.—Resident Catholics and non-Catholics, through their contributions, have practically assured the erection of the hospital in Bend, proposed by the Sisters of Charity of Nazareth, whose headquarters are in Lexington, Ky. Of the necessary \$6,750 with which to purchase the property in Bend, approximately \$5,000 has been subscribed by local citizens desirous of seeing the institution situated in Bend. It is expected that the entire amount will be subscribed by the end of the week, and the final details of closing the deal for the purchase of the property known as the water tower site, will be completed.

ONE ITEM VETO SELF-EXECUTING

ATTORNEY GENERAL BROWN
HOLDS THAT NO ADDITIONAL
LEGISLATION IS NEEDED TO
MAKE MEASURE EFFECTIVE

SALEM, Jan. 15.—Attorney General Brown has rendered an opinion to the effect that under the single item veto amendment, passed at the last election by the people, the same procedure is to be followed as on the veto of an entire bill, and that no necessity exists for further legislation to make it effective. The question was put to the attorney general by the governor. The latter is empowered to veto any single item of an appropriation bill and the legislature is enabled to act upon that single item while the remainder of the bill becomes a law with the signature of the governor, according to Mr. Brown.

Governor Withycombe is determining the meaning of the veto amendment so that, if it becomes necessary, he can use it on measures.

EIGHT MILLION ACRES OF FOREST LANDS TAKEN UP

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 15.—More than eight million acres of land was eliminated from the national forests, and more than 1,100 individual tracts within the forests were made available for homestead entry in the last fiscal year as a result of land classification work, according to the annual report of Henry S. Graves, chief of the forest service.

Bad for Free-Lunchers
DETROIT, Mich., Jan. 15.—Twenty thousand patrons of barroom lunch counters in Detroit will have to find new eating places after May 1, 1918, when Michigan goes dry. It is estimated that this number of men eat their noonday meal in saloons, where the profits of the bar trade enables the proprietors to give better and cheaper service than can the regular restaurants. Saloon men declare that 50 per cent of their "eating patrons" never touch intoxicants.

Girl Can't Keep Pawn
ASHLAND, Wis., Jan. 15.—After rescuing a doe fawn in a river near here, and taming it so it would follow her wherever she went, little Henrietta Trunkman, 5 years old, was ordered to turn the doe over to state game wardens, because the Wisconsin law prohibits the keeping of deer in captivity by private individuals. The doe is now on exhibit at the state game farm at Whitewater, Wis. Henrietta cried, but what difference did that make to the state law.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 15.—The treaty signed by the government of Denmark, agreeing to sell the Danish West Indies to Uncle Sam for \$25,000,000, was expected to arrive at the state department from Copenhagen today. When Secretary Lansing has placed his signature on the document the islands, long coveted by Uncle Sam for a naval base, will be, virtually, the property of the United States.
