

# Strahorn May Ask Two Million of Portland

## Railroad Builder Expects to Name This Amount for Portland and Raise Rest in the East

Robert E. Strahorn, president and organizer of the Oregon, California & Nevada railroad, is expected in Portland tomorrow from a trip to Klamath Falls and probably will be ready to submit a definite proposition to the business and banking interests regarding the financing of the project.

In addition to a total of more than \$2,000,000 which the communities of south-central Oregon districts have pledged, some of the towns have agreed to donate rights of way for terminal facilities. Property owners at Klamath Falls, the western terminus of the proposed system, are said to have given adequate grounds for terminals and are ready to make additional concessions if needed.

The routes of the various connecting lines have been surveyed and definitely designated. It is estimated that it will require approximately \$4,000,000 to build the 400 miles of road. How much of the amount is expected to be subscribed in Portland Mr. Strahorn has not definitely stated, but it is intimated that at least \$2,000,000 will be asked from Portland interests.

It is planned to market the remaining portion of the bonds in the East—Oregonians.

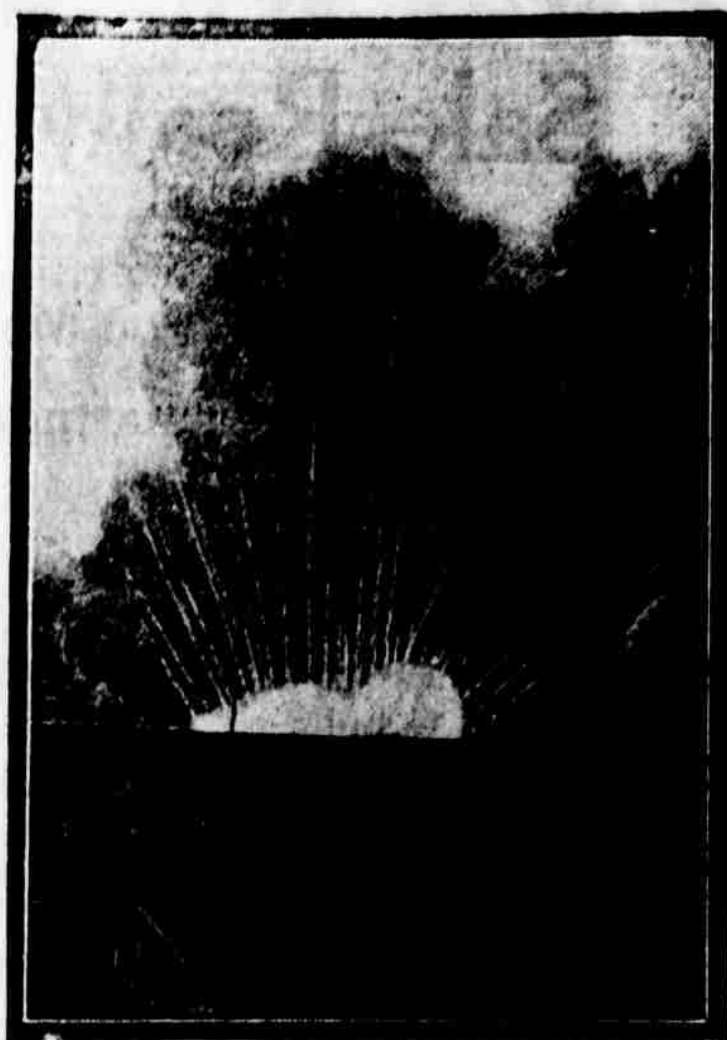

## CONSOLIDATION BILLS OFFERED

DAIRY AND FOOD DEPARTMENTS OF STATE WOULD BE MERGED UNDER BILLS FILED BY SEN. ATOR HAWELY

SALEM, Jan. 19.—Two consolidation bills, S. B. No. 67, by Senator Hawely, calling for the merging of the duties of the sealer of weights and measures with those of the dairy and food commissioner, and the other, S. B. No. 66, providing for consolidating the offices of the dairy and food commissioner with the state board of health, by Senator Barrett, were introduced in the senate yesterday afternoon.

The Barrett bill provides that money heretofore appropriated to the Oregon Social Hygiene Society be used by the state board of health, and putting all county and city health officers under the control of the state board of health.

The Hawely bill would remove the sealer of weights and measures from the control of the state treasurer and food commissioner.

BEND MILLMEN MUST CUT ICE TO KEEP PONDS OPEN—COLDEST WEATHER OF THE WINTER REPORTED

BEND, Jan. 19.—Bend is in the throes of the coldest weather experienced here this winter, and with the mercury registering 4 degrees below zero, employees at the big mills here are kept busy chopping out ice from the mill pond in order that a sufficient supply of logs may be freed to justify the band saws being kept in operation.

Trouble is also experienced at the plant of the Bend Water, Light and Power company, where constant vigilance is needed to keep anchor ice from floating in and jamming the power wheel.
