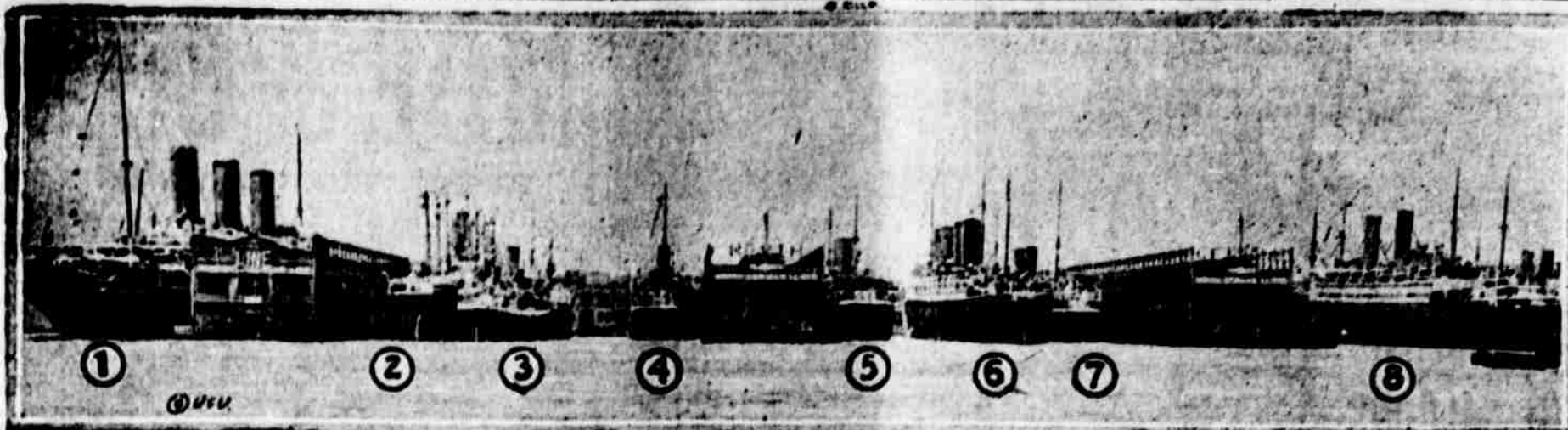
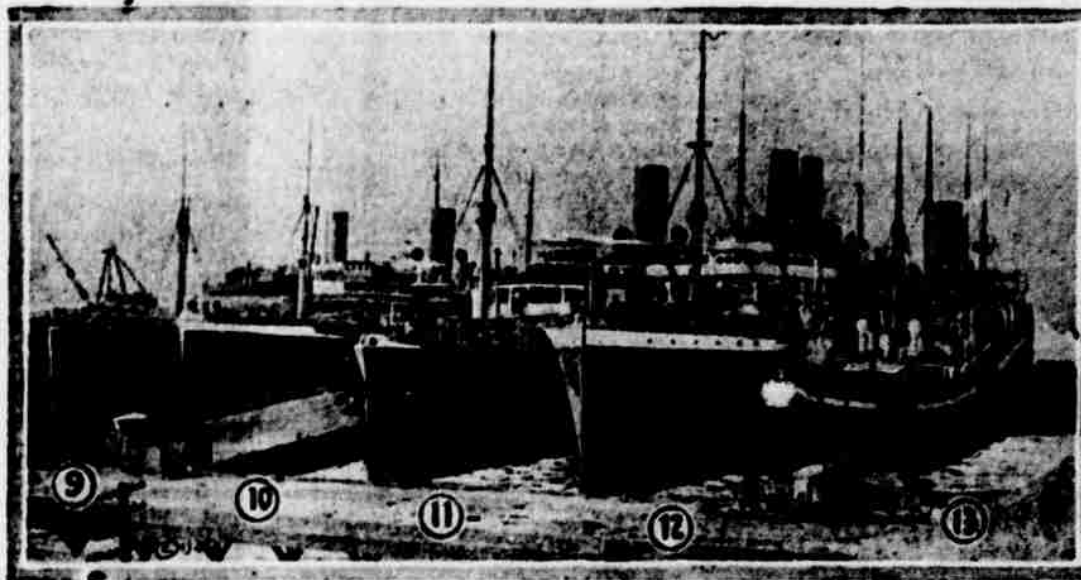


German Ships in Hunson River Worth \$96,000,000 May Be Seized by Uncle Sam

Shipping experts familiar with the value of steamers since the European war began believe the value of the German and Austrian steamers interned in New York harbor is no less than \$140,000,000. Those in the Hunson River, at Hoboken, N. J. and 135th street, New York city, which are shown in these photographs, are worth \$96,000,000. If Germany and the United States go to war these vessels will likely be seized by Uncle Sam. The Vaterland, which is among them, is the largest vessel afloat, unless the Germans have built other and greater vessels since the war began.

Mrs. W. E. Hill returned Sunday evening from Central California. She has been visiting her sister, Mrs. Warren Dodd, and her relatives.

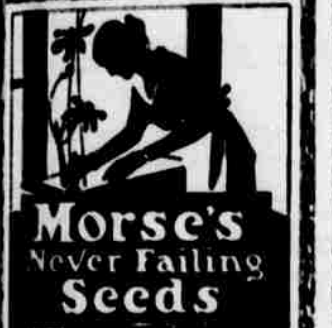
Carl Nightingale expects the arrival of a new member to his family.
